estate be sold and equally divided among my eight children

Seneca Gaines to them and their heirs forever
it is my wish that the beds which my late Son Christopher and his
sons have had to occupy to them be valued and included in
this part of Legacy

I do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Jonathan Williams

I give to my friend William Shore all my Land one negro man named John
During his natural life at his death I wish the above named Lazarus & Mary & John
Equally divided between them the other living children of the above named family
I give to the first I term
I term the 1st of January next I do give what my old servant King for his Masterous
services also the Negro Henrietta Little King to be left free & I wish it to be given
to her that I give to the above named King first heir of the above named Lazarus

also any place he pleases on the Island of Land & shore manor I give the above
named Shays to him & his heirs for ever it is also my wish that the above named
King forth support of him every year During his life of 100 years pay

108 he can make out the property to and his wife Deborah Mrs. Garris to act as guardian for King. To see that he is not interrupted by any person in his good behavior & I give to little King one Gallon Caledonian Brandy and Solder to him his heirs for ever & my wife shall take King have fifty Dollars out of the money owing from the sale of my estate for above named to be left in the hands of Mr. William Shire after him to deal it out as he may thinks little King stands in need of.

Item 5th I give to Mary Gowing one chest of Drawers I also give Rebekah Richard my clock & Dolly Buxton first choice of my Clocks
Item 6th I give to Bridget Ellings Twenty Dollars per year which money is to be paid out of my estate I also give a Wash Day Cap one negro girl named Priscilla during her life it is to be understood that she above named & all the rest of the Children of Cook Chocklet go to Mary Garris in the City of New York my wife shall also pay her in her Power to choose where she will whom she wishes to live with among his children & a few I give to King one little box of furniture I also give to Mrs. Mary Parker one Chair 130 feet
Item 7th It is my wish that all the balance of my estate both real & personal notwithstanding he shall determine money owing therefrom be equally divided between Peter Bumpf son of Newell Parker Bumpf the child of Rebekah Stanton William Stanton son of H. Stanton Polley Stanton formerly now in the western Country known by the name of Polley Shatt to them & their heirs for ever

Lastly I nominate my Friend William Shire & Dempsey Garris Executor to this my last Will & Testament this 2^d Day of July

do make this my will this 1st day of first month of January Christ
one thousand eight hundred and thirty
I do make my will and desire that my wife Rebekah wife of the deceased Plaintiff
where we now live are in any part of the world together with my other
property that is not situated in the following lines that we may dwell together
together during our lifetime

2nd Secondly I give to my son Samuel Parker all the cash and other property to
more be had in his possession at the time he set off to the State of Louisiana
to him and his heirs forever

3rd Thirdly I give to my son Thomas Parker the part of the land whereon
I live about the middle of the river east straight with the
center of the Line to the west side between my Land and Miller Langford's

line for him to be in possession of all the land north of his building which I am now
holding him in possession off and no man during his life time standing to a loss
for me to him and his heirs forever &
I further I give to my daughter Rebekah Copeland all the property she has had from
me to her and her heirs forever
5th fifthly I give to my son William Parker (now resident of the State of Indiana)
all that he has in his care or possession that was mine and four hundred dollars
in Cash what he receives from me in my life time is so much paid toward that
sum given to him and his heirs for ever

6th Sixthly I give to my son Nathan Parker all the property he has had of mine and the
land wherein I now live to the south of the line to a person not less than one
hundred and one feather head and for me to have and keep four shillings
to him and his heirs for ever

7th Seventhly I give to my two youngest daughters Rebekah Parker and Phoebe Mary
Parker each a feather bed and furniture back four head of cattle each a
cow and calf to them and their heirs forever

8th Eighthly I give to my four daughters Rebekah Copeland, Indiana Weston, Elizabeth
Villa Mary Parker all the remaining part of my property whatever
wherever after the death of their mother to them and their heirs for ever
9th Ninthly it is my desire that my sons Thomas & Nathan Parker be my executors
