

**Stanley Thompson's Will** In the name of God Amen I Stanley Thompson of Southampton County State of the Carolina being sick in body but of sound mind and perfect memory blessed be God for the same do this being sick and of legal age in the year of our Lord one thousand and thirty make and contain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that I do give first of all my just debts and funeral expenses I lend all my Estate both personal and personal Amicable and Consoling furniture to my Brother Samuels Clerk & Heeling During his natural life.

Secondly at the desire of my brother and sister I give to each and every lawful Heir to my Estate for Whitting a piece of land and these heirs forever Thirdly the remaining part at this death I give and bequeath to James D. Bap for the use of the Buffaloes to be and his heirs forever I had do him by Constable and appoint my truly friend William Buffaloe Executor to this my last Will and Testament Of Witness my hand and seal this day and date above written I send seal and delivered in the presence of as follows

The last Will and Testament of Stanley Thompson deceased was exhibited in open Court and proved in due form of law by the oath of William Drake and Matthew Buffaloe the Subscribers Witnesses thereto and sworn to be correct Whereupon William Buffaloe the Executor therein named qualified as the same Court doth so test

**Council Bap's Will** In the name of God Amen I Council Bap being of sound mind and memory this the 23 day of September in the year of our Lord 1833 do make and contain this my last Will and Testament in following

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha a Slave all my land on the North side of the Road leading from Bryant's Road to Richquance to her and her heirs forever I also lend unto her during her natural life the following negroes that is to say Thomas a John Nancy Alfred Isaac and Jackson and after her death I give and bequeath the above named negroes to her surviving Children to be equally divided amongst them to them and their heirs forever

Item 2 I give all my land on the South side of the Road leading from Bryant's Road to Richquance including my dwelling house with the following negroes that is to say Harry Brady, Nephew Jackson and Willie unto Bryan Randolph in Trust for the benefit of my daughter Elizabeth Bap during her life and after her death I give and bequeath the said land on the South side of the Road leading from Rich Square to Bryant's Road with the negroes Harry Brady, Nephew Jackson & Willie unto her surviving Children to be equally divided amongst them but what the said Elizabeth Bap not have any child or children at her death then the said negroes to be divided with the land amongst the Children of Martha a Slave It is my Will that the Trustee Bryan Randolph pay unto my daughter Elizabeth Bap annually the amount of the Rent of said land & share of said negroes after removing what may be necessary for the support of the three old negroes & Harpers Rice & Boggy which slaves have been in the plantation as long as they live unto my daughter Elizabeth for her own use and benefit and the same be not subject to the order or use of her husband in any thing whatsoever

Item 3 I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Susan Ellen Ann Bap, negroes Gene Mary Jane and Andrew to her and her heirs forever also one Red Horse named

Item 4 I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Ann Ellen & Hoggins negroes Service to her and her heirs forever also one Red and freemason

Item 5 I give and bequeath unto Charlotte Williams my daughter two negro girls named Ransella and Brittain to her and her heirs forever

Item 6 I leave all the balance of my Estate that is not already given away to be sold by my Executor for the payment of my just debts also it is my will and desire that all my negroes remain in the care of my Executor for the payment of my debts one year from the 1st day of January after my death then to be delivered as heretofore mentioned after the payment of all my just debts it is my will and desire that the Executor should there be any in hands of my Executor be equally divided between my daughter Martha a Slave, Elizabeth Bap and my Grand daughter Ann Ellen & Hoggins I do nominate and appoint my friend James D. Bap Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date first above written

Southampton County November Novr 1830

The last Will and Testament of Council Bap decd. was exhibited in open Court and proved in due form of law by the oath of William Balan and sworn to be correct The Executor therein named refused to qualify Whereupon in Motion Administration upon the Goods & Chattels Rights & Credits of the Estate of the said Council Bap decd. with the Will annexed was granted to Joseph East, who entered into Bond as the law directs in the penalty of Ten thousand Dollars with William Miles and Edmund Jacobs Sureties
