Jeffe Underwood's Will.

In the name of God amen. I Jeffe Underwood of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina, being weak in body but of disposing mind and memory do make and execute this my last will and testament in manner and form to witt:

I bind unto my beloved wife Christiane Underwood my land and plantation wherein now lie - with all the appurtenances thereto belonging during her natural life and after her death. I give and bequeath unto my son Jeffe Roman Underwood the said land and plantation with all the appurtenances thereto belonging to him and his heirs forever.

I bind unto my son Neal Underwood the land and plantation wherein he now lies containing by estimation one hundred acres during his natural life and after his death it is my will and desire that the said land and plantation be sold in the best price that can be obtained and the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided between my children - the living to them and their heirs forever.

I bind unto my beloved wife Christiane Underwood my negroes Jacob & Beck during her life and after her death I give and bequeath said negroes unto all my children whom I hereby to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever.

Fourthly, is to the remaining part of my estate of every description whatever after the payment of my just debts it is my will and desire shall be equally divided among my wife Christiane Underwood & all my children living which I give to them and their heirs forever.

Fifthly, I nominate and appoint Matt Calvert my Executor to this my last Will & Testament revoking all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made and declaring this to be my last Will & Testament. Writings my hand and seal this 15th day of January A.D. 1830.

Abram Dardens Will.

In the name of God amen. Abram Darden of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory thank be God for the same, do publish this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say)

I bind unto my beloved wife Sarah Darden the use of the whole of my tract of land known and call'd Roanoke place during her natural life also I give unto my wife Sarah Darden one Negro woman named Rachel to her and her heirs for ever. I also bind her three negroes named at the end & Savoy during her natural life she I give to my wife Sarah Darden the following property (namely) one horse saddle and bridle and trapping chair and two young two cows and calves two hogs & pigs & four head of other hogs two sheep two lambs but my feather bed & furniture in chest or setting chairs two pincers Boxes six pewter plates & one table to her and her heirs forever.

Item my will and desire is for the balance of my profitable Estate to be sold and the money arising therefrom to pay all my just debts and if any balance after paying my debts to be for the use of my daughter Sarah. Also I give unto my son John Darden all my lands negro named & Savoy after the death of my wife Sarah. I further give unto my son John Darden five negroes named Dixie, Isaac, Dick & Henry to him and his heirs forever in consequence of the slave (Am.) Darden having lawful issue out of the slave John Darden that aforesaid is lawful issue than in that case my will & desire is for the whole of the property left to John Darden to be given to my two nephews Reddick Darden & Edmund Darden sons of my Brother Reddick Darden to them and their descendants both share alike and so further nominate my friend James Atwood my whole and sole Executor to this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills hereby me made. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand & seal this 5th day of July 1827.
