Nicholas Edmunds Will

In the name of God Amen. I Nicholas Edmunds being of a sound and  
disposing mind and knowing that all men are to die so make and ordain this  
to be my last will and Testament.

First I recommend my soul into the hands of an all merciful creator and  
my body to be decently interred. As to my worldly estate I do will and bequeath  
it in the following manner to wit

Item For the love and affection which I have for my brother Samuel Edmunds  
I give and bequeath to him the aforesaid Samuel Edmunds his heirs and assign-  
ments forever the whole of my estate let it consist in what it may say Lands  
Negroes money bonds & accounts and every other species of property what-  
ever to dispose of in such manner as he may think proper. I leave my Brother  
Samuel Edmunds my sole Executor to this my last will and Testament  
Signed and sealed this the fourth day of July one thousand eight hundred  
and thirty eight

This paper writing purporting to be the last will & Testament of Nicholas Edmunds  
was exhibited in open Court and proved in due form of law by the oath of Samuel  
Edmunds & others being duly sworn & after a long & try that they  
truly believe the said paper writing & every part thereof to be in the proper hand  
writing of the said Nicholas Edmunds and it appearing to the Court the

said paper writing was deposited in the hands of Samuel Edmunds by the  
Court for safe keeping. Thereupon it is ordered & adjudged by the Court that the  
said paper writing purporting to be the last will & Testament of Nicholas Ed-  
munds and is duly proved as the last will & Testament of said Nicholas as to  
both real & personal Estate & that the same be recorded and it appearing to the  
Court that the said Samuel Edmunds is not a resident of this State it is ordered  
that he undertake bond & security whereupon Samuel Edmunds the Executor  
named in said will entered into bond in the penalty of fifteen thousand dollars  
conditioned with Simmons Barrow & Elizabeth J. Public Securities, and gave  
up as the law directs

Title of Northampton County in the name of God Amen  
Northampton County } I Sully Grant of the County & State aforesaid being  
well in body but of some weakness & considering  
the certainty of death & the uncertainty of this mortal life do make and ordain  
this my last will & Testament in manner & form following

1st I leave my 10 negro woman Polly to my brother James Grant during his life  
2nd I give and bequeath to my sister Polly Grant and her heirs forever the  
residue of my estate of every description to my sister Polly and her heirs or assigns  
forever after paying my debts.

3rd I do nominate & appoint my friend Theobald Grant my Executor to see  
my last will & Testament in witness whereof I do hereby set my hand & seal  
this 20th day of November in the year of our Lord 1839
