

William Wilson Will

Northampton County & State of North Carolina

In the name of god amen I William Wilson of the aforesaid County & State being of disposing mind & memory do make and ordain this my last will & Testament revoking all others heretofore made by me in manner and form following Item 1<sup>st</sup> In the first place it is my will & desire that all my debt be paid

Item 2<sup>d</sup> The lands which Barnata Pope now has or after his death I give unto his wife & children & during his life I give him the said Pope the privilege of residing or living on and culturing the aforesaid lands free of charge and that the aforesaid lands shall not be sold to pay any debt or debts which the said Pope may or have heretofore contracted

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I bear unto my wife Elizabeth Wilson during her natural life all the property which I may due in possession of (to wit) land negro stock of every description house hold & kitchen furniture bonds money and every other description of property which I may own at my death

Item 4<sup>th</sup> after the death of my wife Elizabeth Wilson I give unto Henry Hasty one tract of land called the Pope tract containing two hundred and thirty four acres more or less but provided the said Hasty should die without a lawfull heir from his body in that event I give the aforesaid land to Nedice Williams & Clementine Taylor to be equally divided to them & their heirs forever

Item 5<sup>th</sup> after the death of my wife Elizabeth Wilson I give unto William Allen the son of Nathaniel Allen one negro girl name Meriah to him & his heirs forever

Item 6<sup>th</sup> after the death of my wife Elizabeth Wilson I give unto Ann Eliza Oldridge the daughter of Mr Alfred Oldridge one negro girl name Harriett to her and her heirs forever

Item 7<sup>th</sup> after the death of my wife Elizabeth Wilson all the remainder of the property which I have not disposed of or given away I give unto Nedice Williams & Clementine Taylor to be equally divided to them & their heirs forever

Item 8<sup>th</sup> I do constitute and appoint my friend Doctor Alfred Colander executor to this my last will & testament as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 2<sup>nd</sup> of March eighteen hundred & forty one

Mary Ashurst Will

In the name of god Amen I Mary Ashurst of the County of Northampton being sick of body here of several years and having thanks to god for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following (viz.)

Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Littlebury Ashurst and Joseph Ashurst the land and plantation Wilson I now live yet being the land which descended to me by the death of my father Nathaniel Wilson to them and their heirs forever

Item my will and desire is that my tract of land which I purchased of Isaac Vaughan together with all my property not given away be sold by my executors and after paying all my just debts out of the proceeds arising from said sale the balance (if any) to be equally dividing among all my sons (to wit) James Womble, Samuel Littlebury Nichols and Joseph Ashurst to them and their heirs forever

Item my will and desire is that my executor be and he is hereby fully empowered and authorized to sell the above tract of land which I purchased of Isaac Vaughan together with any of my other property left to be sold and to pay my just debts as soon as possible Lasting I do nominate and appoint my good and reputable friend Charles Hasted executor to this my last will and testament revoking and superseding all other wills heretofore by me made in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 18<sup>th</sup> day of December 1843
