

Nathan Notton Will

In the Name of God Amen I Nathan Notton being in perfect health and in my perfect mind do make this my last will and Testament I then the first I give and bequeath unto my living wife one bay horse one cart and wheels two cows & calves one sow and pigs one feather bed and furniture one walnut table one chest with the furniture belonging to the said wife during her natural life then it is my will and desire that my son Samuel Not I Notton shall have the above mentioned Articles and of the said sum I should die without a lawful issue then I will be divided between the rest of my children.

Item I give to my daughter Martha one bed and furniture one cow & calf I give to my daughter Mary one bed & one cow & calf I give to my daughter Emily P. Notton one bed & one cow & calf one chest & table give to my Margaret & Notton one bed & one cow & calf one chest & one sow and pigs I give unto my son Samuel Not I Notton the tract of land which is now known by the name of the Lawrence tract it is my will also desire for my tract of land lying in an area County to be sold and pay my debts and as much of my other property that is not given away as will pay my last debts and as for my two Negroes I would them sold and equally divided between my five children namely Martha Mary Emily Margaret and Samuel I want my wife to have for the support of my wife and three small children & this 30 day of September 1839 I seal and sign in the presence of Nathan Notton

of Wake County North Carolina 1839.
This paper relating purporting to be the last will & Testament of Nathan Notton do as aforesaid and of our own knowledge and belief we believe that they really believe the said paper contains & is my free & true will and the proper legal writing of the said Nathan Notton do. It is therefore ordered by the Court that the said paper purporting to be the last will & Testament of the said Nathan Notton do be admitted & recorded.

In the Name of God Amen I George W. Dennis of the County of Wake and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind & memory do this 22nd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four make this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say.

I Give and bequeath unto my wife Dorothy Dennis in case she should be alive within nine months from my death all of my Estate after paying my just debts. If she should be no alive within nine months from my death it is my will & desire that my wife should have all of my lands that I am now possessed of during her life and at her death to Joseph W. Dennis.

Item I Give unto my wife Twelve of the first choice of my Negroes and also I give to my wife all of my stock of all kinds horses held and
