plantation where Col. Edward Williams now  
lives which I give to him in a deed of gift  
which said land said James all Dixon conveyed  
away to William McCDaniel.

Item the 2 I give and bequeath to my grand  
daughter Sarah E Dixon on place named  
Lucy to her forever.

Item the 3 I give to my grand son Thomas  
D Dixon on place named Balcon to him forever

Item the 4 I give to my grand daughter Mary  
A Dixon on place named Abby to her forever.

Item the 5 I give to my grand daughter Ellen V  
I Dixon on place named Ellen to her forever.

Item the 6 I give to my grand son James D Dixon on  
place named Haddie to him forever.

Item the 7 I give to my grand daughter ~~Ellen~~  
I Dixon on place named Ellitha to her forever  
My son James all Dixon has already conveyed the  
above mentioned property from me.

Item the 8 I give to my grand daughter Sarah E  
Dixon a half dozen silver table spoons to her forever  
Item the 9 I give to my grand daughter Minnie D  
Dixon a half dozen silver tea spoons to her forever  
Also I give to my son James all Dixon one  
other more by named Primes

Item the 10 I give to my daughter Mary Wood  
one large Mahogany dining table one silver chair  
to her when she is forever. One dressing table  
box, mounting, also one bed and furniture  
also one hand mill, one pair flat iron, one  
kitchen to her and her heirs forever.

Item the 11 I give to my grand daughter Mary  
Anne Wood a half dozen silver tea spoons  
to her forever.

Item the 12 I give to my son in law W. Wood  
all my stock of pigs to him forever, and I leave  
all the remaining part of my estate that is not  
mentioned in the above will or otherwise disposed  
of except in years sufficient that I give to my  
son in law W. Wood for his family at the

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devotion of my Executors herein after named  
to be done by my Executors and the proceeds  
arising, with all my State, Personal, and assets  
to be equally divided between my son Samuel  
Steen and my daughter Mary Wood except  
one hundred dollars then given to my son  
Samuel a share out of the estate I have of  
my clothes in linen article. Lastly I nominate  
and appoint my two worthy friends to wit  
John Tipton Esq and William Smith my  
Executors to this my last will and testament  
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seal this the 14th day of January 1833
