toms Creek called Mark Field and from the upper part of Mark Field at a dreane
which forms a ledge of Bond that runs a Northward Westerly course up the road
that goes to his fathers from my house a cart road a line to be made by my exe-
cutor agreeable to this direction if not done in my life time I further give my
grandson the plantation where I now live adjoining the said mark Field with the
houses and improvements also give the said Brice one half of the back land adjoining
the aforesaid land the turpentine trees excepted the above peice of land I
give to the said Brice his heirs and assigns forever.

12th: I give my grandson Brice Fonville one feather bed and furniture one small
trunk, one small chest and the chairs about the house and kitchen furniture one
plow & two hoes & two axes two grubbing hoes my coopen tools one cart six earth-
ern plates two dishes and knives & forks that is about the house, one looking
glass, and glass ware about the house two sows and pigs.

13th: I give to my grandson Thomas Jefferson Fonville all the land that lies between
the land I have given to his brother Brice and a large swamp adjoining his father
land running up to the same road as his brother Brice line and I give the sd
Thomas the other half of the back land adjoining the before mentioned land to
him his heirs and assigns forever, with the same exception of the trees & turpen-
tine as his brother Brice the back land to be divided lenthways.

14th: I give unto Elish Ersson one feather bed two duck blankets & two sheets,
two cows and calves two sows and pigs to him his heirs and assigns forever.

15th: My will and desire further is that all my hands be kept together untill
the present crop of turpentine and corn together with the tarkil on hand should
be finished and got together and after given my grandson Brice one half of the
corn provided he attend to and work in the crop untill it is finished I wish to
be sold at the descretion of my executors and applied as hereafter mentioned.

16th: It is further my will and desire that my son Edward & daughter Fanny
should be allowed reasonable hire for such of their negroes respectfully as may
be employed in the crop of turpentine, tar, & corn according to the time they
are employed.

17th: further my will and desird is that all my real and personal estate that
is not here willed away be sold by my executors and after my just debts are paid
then and with what money notes accounts together with the sale of the Noval Stones
before mentioned with one half of the corn, after paying my daughter Fanny the
two hundred dollars as before mentioned, be equally divided between my son Edward
my daughter Fanny, and my grandson Brice Fonville.

I hereby constitute and appoint my son Edward & my worth friend William montfort
executors to this my Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and affixed my seal this April 7th day One Thousand Eight Hundred &
Twelve.

North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God for it
do this Twenty Six th day of November One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Six
do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner following that is
to say.

First I give unto my beloved wife Eulina Young two negroes named Drunilla and
Isaac and all the cattle that her father gave her one horse called Liberty sadd-
le and bridle her bed and furniture also all my churs and the large table all my
Crockery ware and Pewter my knives and forks also twelve of my best fat hogs also
my yoke of oxens one large trunk one pot one dutch oven also all my geese two
fluke plughs one bar plow four sows and pigs eight head of sheep and all my books
also Forty barrels of corn one Ax two weeding hoes one half dozen tea spoons to
her and her heirs forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath unto my three children Mary Young, Nancy Young and
Edward Young the following negroes that is to say Handy Mary, Daniel, Lewis
Chelsea, Rachel, Miler, and Peggy, the said negroes to be equally divided between
my above mentioned children when they arrive at the age of eighteen or marry to
them their heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Mary, one bed and furniture one set of silver
table spoons to her her heirs and assigns forever.

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Nancy one bed and furnitur one silver soup spoon
to her and her heirs forever.

ITEM: I give unto my son Edward Young all the land that I am possessed of also
one horse, bridle and saddle, one bed and furniture, to him his heirs and assigns
forever.

ITEM: I give unto the child that my wife is pregnant with the two negroes named
Dick and Molly one bed and furniture to it and its heirs forever.

My will is that my two negroes named Andrew and Charlott be sold at publick
or private sale at the descretion of my executors.

My will is that all my above mentioned negroes shall be hired at the descretion
of my executors and the money arising with all my notes and accounts and articles
sold to be put to the use of schooling and raising all my above mentioned children
after paying my just debts then if there should be any money arising after the
above mentioned support for it to be equally divided between all my children
when my daughter Mary arises to the age of eighteen or marries to them and their
heirs forever.

My will is that if either of my children should die befor they come to the above
mentioned age that at their legacy or legacies should be equally divided between
them that are living to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Jesse Williams and Wood H.
Rhodes executors of this my Last Will and testament. revoking all others by me
heretofore made acknowledging this only to be my Last in witness whereof I the said
Edward Young have set my hand affixed my seal the day and year above written.

In The Name of God Amen; I Benjamin Yeates of the County of Onslow and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this tenth day of September in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner following, that is to say when it pleases God to call me from this world, That my executors will have my body carried to the place that I sold to Benjamin Oliver where part of my children is buried as I reserved the burying ground when I sold the land and there to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors & first my will and desire is that so much of my personal property as will do to pay all my just debts to be sold by my executors to the best advantage as they think proper to settle the sd debts and if there should be any remaining of my personal property after settling my just debts the same to be equally divided among my wife and children.

ITEM: I leave to my beloved wife Patty Yeates my bay horse two calves one feather bed & furniture further my will & desire is that my wife should keep my children as long as she can do a good part by them but if throa. turn or change of providence they should come to suffer or delt bad with for my executors to take my son Silas & do the best they can with him my step mother will take my daughter Caty but as long as their mother can do a good part by them to keep them my will & desire is that sons Thomas, Benjamin, & Silas, have one year schooling out of their parts of my property & further desire is that my daughter Patsey & Caty have one years schooling out of their part of my estate.

ITEM: I leave to my son Son Thomas Yeates three sows & three pounds nine shillings in money as a debt do from me to him.

ITEM: I leave to my youngest son Benjamin Yeates one pound six shillings sixpence as a debt do from me to him & one sow and pigs to him likewise.

ITEM: I leave to my daughter Patsey two sows forever.

ITEM: I leave a sufficient support for my wife & children out of my crop & hogs for the ensuing year it is to be understood that what I have mentioned hear left to my children is to them and their heirs forever further my will & desire is for all my lands that I purses for to be sold and the money to be equally divided among all my children, namely Thomas, Lurany, Patsey, Benjamin, Caty, & Silas, only my wife Patsey Yeates to have her thirds of the land laid off to her on the plantation where I now live as my executor think most to her advantage.

ITEM: I give to my daughter Lurany my hat, & my clothes I leave to be equally divided among my three sons, my further will & desire is that Charles Nixon John Fullwood Esq. and Zephaniah Ward be the three men that I have made choice to act and do my business as my executors to this my Last Will and Testament.

In the name of God Amen; I John Yopp of the County of & State aforesaid being weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make this my Last Will and Testament in the manner and from as follows.

ITEM: First I lend to my beloved wife Wingerford Yopp the use of my plantation where she now lives on the head of Alligator Creek and divided from the lands whereon my son John Yopp deceased former lived by the Mill Swamp to her during her natural life.

Secondly: I give my three negroes Harry, Gate, and Clare and half of my stock of cattle that is now on the aforesaid plantation except the five big steers also all the hogs that is on the said plantation one horse call Tom one saddle and bridle two bed and furniture I lend my desk to her during her life I give all my pewter with all the provisions that is at the said plantation and all the kitchen furniture and two chest & the chairs one table one wooden wheel one linnin wheel, I lend my wife one Cupboard during her life I give also all the above articles to my wife except that is lent to her and her assigns forever.

ITE 3: I give to my beloved son Jerome Yopp my plantation whereon I now live containing five hundred & ten acres my deed from Fredrick Fonville and patent for ten acres granted to me John Yopp also I give to my son Jerome Yopp five hundred dollars three hundred and sixty dollars due on a note on Asa Hatch and one hundred and thirty four in cash which includes the whole of the afore mentioned five hundred dollars also the one half of my stock and cattle that is on the said river plantation except three oxen and one steer and half of the stock of hogs one cupboard and the desk lent my wife after her death and half of the kitchen furniture that I have on the said plantation one bed and furniture that I now live on my young horse saddle and bridle which articles I give to my said son Jerome Yopp to him and his heirs forever.

ITEM: I give to my two grand daughters Margaret & Elizabeth Ennett the daughters of Nathaniel Ennett and his wife Molly my negro woman Ziner & her three boy children named Tulley, Peter, and Jim with her future increase to be equally divided between when they come of age or marries I give the aforesaid negroes to my aforesaid grand daughters to them their heirs and assigns forever & my will and desire is that the above negroes given to Margaret and Elizabeth Ennett remain in the care of my Executors hereafter mentioned until the said Margaret and Elizabeth Ennett either comes of age or marries.
