hundred acres that I purchased of Edward Williams known
by the name of the fishing patent as per deed will show
also all the remainder of my debts of cattle not here
mentioned of any to him and in his power —

Then I give unto my step daughter Catharine Rhodes three cows & calves —
Then I give unto Samuel & Jacob P. Rhodes sons of Edmund
Rhodes the land on the main road where I now live
which I purchased of David Peltack as per deed will show
with ten hundred acres adjoining that of Long St Edwards
Williams as per deed will show to be equally divided
between them to them their heirs & assigns —

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Now I give unto James & John two sons & heirs to me this my former -
 will of the my wife Agnes death my will & desire is that
John Agnes has my negro slave John with all the
 plantation tools horses, cattle, sheep & sheep all in view
 of my wife Agnes property after her death to be equally
 divided between John & James & John & James & John &
Whites to them & their heirs forever -

Also, I give John & James of Joshua my son & executor
 to the my last will & testament whome I have set
 my hand & seal this 1st day of February 1821 -
