and publish the my last will and testament in the
following manner -

Then I give and bequeath all my land to be equally
divided between my two sons John Fisher and James
Fisher likewise the house and furniture, and the
residue of my property I leave to my beloved wife
during her life or widow hood & after her decease
to be divided equally between my two daughters
Sarah Ann & Eliza Ann -

And I hereby make and create Thomas Mark
born Oct. 10 this my last will and testament I ~~do~~
I William Fisher Do set my hand and seal to this
my last will & testament the day and date first
above written -

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In the name of God Amen this the 31st day of
July 1823 I John Smith of Dallas County being in
a low state of health but of sound mind and
Memory (thanks be to God) and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die, do make, publish and
declare this to be my last will and testament.
That is to say my body I bequeath to its parent
Earth at the discretion of my executors, and disposing
my worldly estate, I dispose of it in the following
manner viz -

first It is my will and desire that my brother Leff
and John Smith have my land that I bought of
Benjamin Binning equally divided between them
after their discharging my estate of a certain sum
of money I am now owing of them (the copy
thereof excepted) to them the said Leff & John shall
their heirs & assigns forever -

I also give unto my sister Polly Barber her heirs
lawfully begotten of her body the town that I bought
of James Whitman to be by her and them, & assigns during
her and their pleasure or to be by her or the surviving of her
heirs, & assigns or to be by her sold under the same restrictions
in favor except prop. title to land, inherited by the
deaths of parents - I also give my brother William
Smith the land I bought of John Barber (the copy of them
excepted) to him the said William his heirs and
assigns forever, my land on which William Smith now
lives I wish to be sold by my Executors at public
sale at six months Credit, the price of which will
be hereafter disposed of hereafter -
I also leave my land that I bought of Benjamin

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to be given to him being the land known as Harry
lots to John King to be sold by my executor at Sep
Month Credit & the thing thereof to be handled & sold
It is also my desire that if a title can ever be obtained
in my name or to my use for the land of my father
to be passed the debt for Abner and bought by me
I give & bequeath unto John Mills a small piece of land
on the south side of my father's land beginning at
corner of David Mills do? land and to be and continue
a straight line to the river swamp, and then down
the line to John Williams land including all the
land below the line beginning from Harry line by
the corner of the David Mills field to the line to the
said John Mills his heirs and assigns forever.

I also give to my brother Lewis Mills a part of the land
tract of land beginning at Harry line on the East
side of the Water Road and running by the lower
corner of David Mills to a drain and down said
drain to the River, all the land above said drain
to said Lewis Mills his heirs and assigns forever.
Then all the land encompassed in the do Williams
Mills claim sold by the collector and bought by me
lying between the line given to John and the line
given to Lewis I give and bequeath to my brother
John Mills & John Mills then his assigns forever.

I also give to Lewis Barden the sum of land I have
a deed for from Richard Barden in his own right &
as special guardian to John together with the sum
of twenty five dollars out of the income of my estate

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and the said negroes to assist him in raising the
Mill land and putting up a mill house at the
Mill formerly Barden's Mill and all my right
to said Mill & plantation as to said Lewis Barden
his heirs and assigns forever.

I also give to my brother John & Lot Mills my negro
man Jack to them and their heirs assigns forever
and in consideration of land given to said Lot and
John & Negro Jack then said Lot & John is to pay
to Lewis Barden the sum of one hundred and fifty
dollars & maintain my Mother during her natural
life.

I also to my brother Williams my negro man Brant
by the said Williams paying my sister Nancy
two hundred and fifty dollars which says Brant
to the said Williams and money to the said
Nancy I give to them the said Williams and
Nancy then heirs and assigns forever.

It is my desire that whenever William Barden
his agent, attorney or friend shall desire to see or copy
or obtain a note I have to said Williams for some
amount of money that my executor or agent to
said Williams his agent or attorney the bill of sale
and thereafter the property of said William Barden
clear of any claim or my self being a creditor
for my executor to pay said William Barden at the
date of thirty five dollars per year for the service of
John, also give a negro girl called to Lewis
Mills his heirs and assigns forever.

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I give and bequeath my negro man and suffraging him
to be worth five hundred dollars to be divided between
Jeph. Smith, Lewis Smith, Harvey Smith, William Smith in
the following Manner (1872).

William to have	2500
Jeph to have	100
Lewis to have	100
Harvey to have	100

I give to Jeph Smith my young grey mare to
him his heirs and assigns forever.

I give Lewis Smith and to the Corp of the Barrens
Plantation twenty barrels of corn to him his heirs & assigns
from the field of the plantation & as from said farm
all the rest as much as is necessary of my right to be
disposed in fattening my stock fit for market.

All the rest of my property not herein disposed of
any description to be sold for the benefit of my
children and if any remains to be equally divided
between my brothers Jeph. Lewis, William, John &
Lill & my sisters Polly and Nancy and to the children
of my brother Dan Smith and the sum of one dollar
each to be my Mother out of my estate hereby, in dollars
to them their heirs and assigns forever.

I also appoint my brother William Smith, Jeph Smith
& John Smith Executors to this my last will and testament
disposing all other wills and actions belonging to be my
will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal

bed, but these I leave to my beloved
wife Sally all the rest of my household furniture
fit to raise my three younger children above
ground and including my stock of every kind
until they come to age a marry and in action
case my wife or that my stock & furniture be
equally divided & set off to them as they come to
age or marry accepting my dear the Elizabeth
to have residence in the beds as I have given
her but to have her equal part in all the
rest with her mother and her younger brothers
then I give to my son Joseph one hundred acres of
