ITEM: I give to my daughter Ruth Malton one feather bed furniture and bedstead also ull the hoge that may be found in William delton mark to her and her heirs forever.

ITEM: I give to my daughter Sahra one cow and calf which cow is called Lillies hefier one sow and pigs two barrow hogs of the best I have one feather bed bed seemed and furniture called her bed two chest one called her and the other mine one cotten wheel and clothe loom, to herandther heirs forever.

Item: I give to my daughter Jemima Cragg, all the property she had off when married consisting of one feather bed and some cattle with other articles also one cow and calf she now has in possession called Cherrie three barrels of corn to be taken out my barn this summer to her and her heirsforever. Also it is my will that my affere mentioned daughter Ruth and Sabra have the use of my dwelling house kitchen and other out houses with my plantation and plantation, and plantitation tools and my negro man Charles and the provisions of all kinds that's now in store also the crop that is now on the land to have and to hold the same peacably and quitely, to direct the same in any manner they see proper and to equally divide the income between them until the first day of January 1814 Then the said plantation a it tools belonging thereto to go to my son John him and his heirs forever and the negro Charles to be sold the money to be equally divided among my children also my Bank's land lying on Core Bank in "artret County to be sold and the money to be equally divided among my daughters and all the rest of my estate both real and personal to be sold and the money to be equally divided among all my children further I do make and ordain my son John Pierson and "avid Ward Executors to this

my Last Will and Testament to take care and see the same performe according to my true intent and meaning .

I then wish my two creaturs mare and horse to be sold to pay my debts and it is my wish that all my undivised estate should be sold and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between my daughter Mancy and my daughter Sarah but if the two creture should not fetch me over and enough to pay my debts I then wish that the debts should be paid out of the monies arising from the above undivised pronerty which was to be divided between the girls VIZ: Mancy and Sraah except I wish that my son John and my son Lewis and my William should have Five shillings sterling a piece to Come out of the property which was ordered to be sold & it is also my wish that my two daughters Elizabeth Newsom and Ritty Pollock should also be given fife shillings sterling out of the property which is ordered to be sold and lastly I make and original my morthy friend Richard Simpson & Richard King my erecutor to this my Last Will and Testament.

man numed Jack and my negroe woman named Sarah also my turning and carpenter tools also the fourth part of my peuter and my best gum and cain and my desk, and case of bottles one young mare and my saddle and bridle and all my plantation or planters tools to continue with the land and more particular I make a reseved agree this date to his two sisters and their first two children Sarah doth bring forever. But if he should deceased without heirs lawfull begotten of his own body then plantation all the legecies except the two negroes to be equally divided between his two younger brothers and his negroes to be equally divided amongest

ITSM: I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Pollock one negro girl named Ruth also one cow and calf & steer yearling one yew, the All heart of my peuter the half of delf ware also my longest looking class also one stripped bed with bed steed and the bluister rugg and sheets also one fine table and my longest iron pot and the hooks thereto belonging and one chair to her and her heirs forever.

ITEM: I give my daughter Elizabeth Pollock one negro girl named Rachell also one bed with white tick bed stead and furniture thereunto belonging, the fourth part of my peuter half of the Delf wair one ovell table and one looking glass one iron pot & hooks thereto belonging one cow and calf & one cow yearling one Ewe & chair to her and her heirs forever.

ITEM: I give to my son John Pollock one negroe girl named Saster also my other gun and my brass kittle one sow and pigs one ewe one cow & Calf & my stillards to him and his hetrs forever.

ITEM: I give and bequeath to my son Jesse Pollock one negro girl named Grace one flow and Caif also one Ewe one iron pot Z hooks one cusing kinfe and steel one sow and pigs and my hand mill to him and his heirs forever. And also I desire that all my effects that is not already mentioned to be appraised and left with my executors for the use of schooling my two sons John and Jesse three years schooling each and also my wearing appearl to be out to the same use above mentioned further more my will and desire is that if any of my children should depart this life under age that the share effects should be equally divided amongest the survivers of my children. I give to the child that my mife now travalls with the first child that Clarey brings after this date to-wit: & the helrs for same forever.

My will and desire is that my negro boy Luke to be sould & the money rased by the sale of him to be applied towards paying of my debts and necessary expenses if they should not be enough to bey as above mentioned the rest to be raised of my plantation and paid in tarr and turpentine. I omitted my books but I desire all my books to equally divided amongest children and wife and if any over plush of cattle be left I desire my. William to have them.

Further I amonint & constitute my beloved wife Sarah Pollock Executor and friend Henry Shodes executor of this my Last Will and Testament Rvoking all other wills by me made and declaring this Will only as my Last Will and Festament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this fwenty second of September 1770.
