ITEM: I give unto my son Daniel Loyd two Hundred acres of land it being the other part of my aforesaid land, two cows and calves, one large iron pot hooks and tramel with it & one large puter dish, two large puter basing and three puter plates.

ITEM: I give unto my son John Loyd One hundred acres of land On(torn, cannot read)

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Suzaner Loyd one feather bed and furniture, one cow and calf, .

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Rebecca Loyd one feather bed and furnitue e and one cow and calf.

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Mary Loyd one feather bed and furniture ene cow and calf one small iron pot one brass Spice morter & beater, one box iron and heators.

ITEM: I give unto mys son Thomas Loyd Twenty shillings Speacy.

ITEM: I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Mashborn twenty Speacy.

ITEM: I give unto Sara Fisher twenty shillings Speacy.

If the or as many of the children as may be of age or married at the above division they or either are to draw in the most legal manner and receive accordingly which I give to them he or she , to their heirs and assigns forever.

Then my whole estate to be kept together by keeping the negroes and stock and the lands rented out or employing mannager as my Executor may think beat.

A division to be in like manner as all the children may come to age or marry as the above which I give to them their heirs and assigns forever, including if a daughter and equal part with all my daughters all my lands on New River or the waters thereof on New River Sanks, reserving the plantation and sufficient
