I then I give to my Son in law John Marsh the five Pounds that is in his own hand never to be taken from him I then I give to my Son in law James Marsh all the money that he owes me never to be demanded from him, I then I give to my daughter Son in law

Bartholomew Rucker five Pounds to be given him by my Son William And Joseph Allison and my Son William Rea— I make and frame

My only and Sole Executors of this my last will and Testament And do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and Ever other former Testaments Wills and Legacies and Executors by me in any way before this time named written and Requisites Ratified and Confirming this no other to be my last will and Testament

 when on Snowline during her widowhood to enable her to support
 Rais and School my Children and after her Widowhood to be
 sold and the money arising from such Sale to be Equally
 Divided between my Children here in after Named, I then give &
 Bequeath to my son James one Saddle Horse & Saddle to him his
 heirs and Assigns for Ever, I then give and Bequeath to my
 Daughter Margaret one large Iron Kettle also I give to my said
 Daughter Margaret what feathers will be left after my
 said wife shall have made her own Bed to her, her Heirs and
 Assigns for Ever I then give and Bequeath to my Daughter
 Eleanor one Iron Cradle to her, her Heirs and Assigns for Ever
 I then give and Bequeath to my son Alexander the Sum of
 fourteen Pounds Speculation Money to him his heirs and Assigns
 for Ever I then give and Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth
 my most large Iron Kettle to her, her Heirs and Assigns for
 Ever I then give and Bequeath to my Daughter Jane my new created
 Chest
