 of Orange being Sick and weak in Body but in perfect mind and
 Memory thanks be to god then gave telling to mind the Necessity
 of my Will and knowing that it is appointed for all men
 Once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament
 that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend
 my Soul into the hands of Almighty god that gave it and
 my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a decent
 Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing
 Doubting But at the General Resurrection I shall Receive
 the Same Again by the Mighty Power of god and as touching
 such worldly Estate when with it hath pleased god to bless me in this
 life I give devise and dispose of the Same in the following manner
 and form and first I give and Bequeath to Rachel my worthy
 beloved wife two hundred Acres of Land which I have on her left
 hand & also all my Household goods & Chattels & movables to Ruse
 and maintain the children until such times as they shall come of
 Age & also I give to my well beloved son Samuel Pinkerton
 whom I also constitute make Ordain to him two hundred
 Acres of Land lying & being on this now inhabited by Humphrey
 Barnell together with his Man and Lady & also
 I give to my well beloved Daughter Mary Nash Barnell whom
 I also will constitute and give the Sum of ten Pounds Proclamation Money
 to each of them & end of the Will that my wife is with
 child be a Daughter and should live it shall be also shared
 with the Rest and yet Ten Pounds Equal to my other Daughters
 which money shall be lived and shared of the Estate & last
 if it be a Son he shall have two hundred Acres of Land at
 his Mothers Death lying on James tract that I now live on
 together with a Horse and Saddle Equal to Samuels

But if a Daughter then the said Land shall be sold and Equally divided with the rest of my children & I do therefore Disannul all & Every other will and Disown and Acknowledge this to be my last will & Testament Signed Sealed pronounced and Attested in presence of us

December the 11th 1774 Henry Lea of Orange County in the Province of North Carolina being sick and weak of Body last of sound Mind and Memory & understanding, do thus for my last will and Testament hereby Revoking all other Wills or Gifts by me heretofore made or Declared by me Either before or Writing, and this only to be taken for my last Will and Testament and None other I first recommend my Soul to God and my Body to be buried in a Christian Manner and as to the settling of the Temporal things that it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I do Dispose of the same in the manner and form following To wit Imprimis I give and Bequeath to my Beloved wife Elizabeth all that part of my Estate that was given to me by her Parents to her her heirs and assigns for ever I then I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Francis all the other Remaining part of my Estate and Every Article as Ample and fully as is mentioned by name to her the Lawfull heirs of her Body or her assigns for ever Provided nevertheless that if my Daughter Francis die without heirs as aforesaid that then my wife Elizabeth retain and keep to her own use one third part of that part Given to my Daughter and the other two parts of the same to return to my Father's Family I further desire that my Wife Elizabeth peacefully possess and Enjoy the whole of my Estate till my Daughter Francis' death or Marriage and that she take care to give the said Francis proper Education and the Cost of schooling to be taken out of the Estate and I appoint my Trusty and well Beloved friends James Lea (my Brother in law) and Anne Mitchell Executors of this my last Will Recommending the Care of my wife and Daughter to God and their Protection Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of John Lea James Roberts Thomas McWill
