my last Will & Testament. That is to say principally &
first of all I give & Recommend my soul into the hands of
almighty God that gave it to my Body & command
to the Earth to be Burned in a decent Christian manner
at the Discretions of my Executors nothing Doubting but
that at the General Resurrection, I shall receive the same
by the Mighty power of God no way touching such mortallity
wherewith it hath pleased God to clothe me in this life

to first Child. I give no Bequest to my wife Belinda
Daughter Parker. at her Marriage or when she leaves
her mother. Then comes to the Child as I give & Bequest
