it be before she is of Age to Dispose of the same.

That then the Estates to my Wife being first satisfied
my Will is that all Estates and Interests hereby
given or devised shall remain to the Daughters of
my Executors which shall be living at the time of
my death.

And I nominate & appoint Willie Jones, &
James Hogg Executors to this my last Will, to whom
also I devise and commit the Guardianship & Education
of my Daughter untill she shall attain to one & Twenty
Years of Age. This is my last Will & Testament
which I have Executed this Fourteenth day of November
One thousand seven hundred and Eighty three.

In the name of god Amen. This 17th day of May in the year of our
Lord 1780. I Thomas Bragier of the County of Orange in the presence of Nath
Crawford being weak of body and in a declining way, but of perfect mind and
sound memory thanks be given unto god, therefore calling to mind the mortality of
my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is
to say humbly and first of all I recommend my Soul unto the hands of Him
that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian and
decent like manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the
General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and
teaching such a worthy Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me with in this
life, I give, devise and dispose and bequeath of the same in the following manner
and form. In premises first of all that all my lawfull debts, and funeral charges
be paid. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Bragier one shilling
sterling money of Great Brittain to be paid at my decease. Item I give and bequeath
unto my son John Bragier one shilling sterling money to be paid at my decease.
Item I give unto my son Aquila Bragier one shilling sterling money of Great
Brittain to be paid at my decease. Item I give and bequeath unto my two
youngest sons James and Samuel Bragier my land and Plantation consisting of
one hundred Acres to be divided equally between them when they arrive at age.
Item I give my daughter Elizabeth Jones one shilling sterling money of Great
Brittain to be paid at my decease.

I give to my daughter Sarah Cyle, one Shilling Sterling money of Great Britain to be paid at my decease. Item I give to my daughter Hannah Tague one Shilling Sterling money of Great Britain to be paid at my decease. Item I give unto my dear and well beloved wife Hannah Brazier all my personal Estate consisting of all my goods and Chattels of every kind whatsoever during her widowhood and at her marriage or decease the said personal Estate to be equally divided among my youngest daughter, Mary, Cessa, Jean and Rachel, to be paid them as they marry or come of age.

But likewise remembered that as my wife is to have the full possession of my personal Estate during her widowhood that is to raise the young Children up, & likewise constitute and appoint John Cyle Senr. and William Cresswell Esqrs. of this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby disallow, revoke and disannul all and every former Wills or Legacies or Testaments by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

Richard Like of the State of North Carolina and County of Orange Farmer, being very sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto god, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain that my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like decent manner, at the discretion of my Executor, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. and as touch: my such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose, of the same in the following manner. ^{Impressis} It is my Will and I do order, that in the first place, all my Just debts, and funeral Charges be paid & satisfied. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Terry six Negroes Ralph, Carter, Leon, Phillis, Sarah, Dany, during her lifetime, and my Will is that said Negroes after the death of my said daughter shall be equally divided amongst her Children which she hath by James Terry, Richard and John. and further my Will is that my daughter Elizabeth Terry aforesaid shall have the use of one negro on an named Dick, during her lifetime, and then to descend to my grandson Richard Like Terry. Item I leave and bequeath unto my daughter Mary some four Negroes Phil, Love, Carter and Phil, now in her possession her lifetime, then Phil and Jude as man and wife to be sold and out paid and the money to be equally divided among my aforesaid daughter Mary's Children. Item I give and bequeath to Richard Like moore one Negro girl named Carter, now in the care of my said daughter Mary moore. Item I give and bequeath to Richard Like moore
