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In the Name of God Amen I Samuel Yarborough of Orange County in North Carolina being very sick but of perfect mind and memory do hereby make this my last Will and Testament and first of all I leave my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to the Earth to be buried in Decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my dear Wife and as to my worldly Substance which God has been pleased to bestow on me I do dispose of it in manner and form following first I leave to my son Theobald five Shillings Sterling having given him before longly at his Marriage also I leave to my Daughter Margaret wife to William Day five Shillings Sterling besides what she got at her Marriage and I leave to my Daughter Mary only two Shillings Sterling and that is to much; I leave to my Daughter Hannah her bed and a new and saddle to be worth ten pounds Virginia Money my Land to my son Robert Donelson at his Widow's Decease or at his Marriage the costs of my two Negroes to my wife and use of the Plantations she raising the rest of my children and schooling and cloathing them till they are all of age I leave my living Wife the third of all my Personal Estate and to Elizabeth Dean, Bettsen, Sarah & Robert I allow each of them an equal Decree of the Remainder of my Estate either Goods Chattels Money due and the two Negroes above mentioned except a new and saddle to my son Robert out of the whole & my heirs or heirs to be for the use of the Family without being valued and I constitute my Wife Hannah Donelson & Mrs Day to be my Executors & The Donelson Cousin and I testify & Confirm this to be my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I set my hand this 20. Day of March 1770

In the Name of God Amen the fifth day of November in the year of Lord 1769 Samuel Yarborough of the County of Orange in the Province of North Carolina being sick and weak in Body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and declare this my last Will and Testament Principally First of all I give and Recommend my Precious and Inerment but into the hands of God that gave it me and as for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and Decent Manner and at the discretion of my Executors whom hereafter I shall appoint nothing doubting but at the same Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and as Touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life After my just Debts are Paid I give devise & dispose of the same as followeth Viz. Inprimis I give and bequeath to my beloved son William Yarborough that Tract of Land lying in Amelia County between his Grand Father's formerly said lying between Cold and Metaway and Schreiver a bottom Tract of Land lying on Savannah River adjoining to Robert Bumpas to him and his heirs forever. I leave also to my beloved wife Sarah Yarborough the Plantations wherewith I now dwell and the Part of Land belonging thereto for and enduring her Natural Life as the whole I leave and bequeath to my beloved son Samuel Yarborough the one half of the Tract of Land now lies on the lower end thereof
