Do make this my last Will and Testament Revoking
all other Will and Wills by me made. First I command
my Soul to Almighty God who gave it me Trusting in
the Merits of my Redeemer, and as to what worldly
Substance I have, I give in manner following Yrs.

Item I leave unto my beloved Wife Martha Bruce
the one half of the Plantation I live on with all the
Stock and Household Furniture During her Natural
Lifetime, and at her Death the half of the Land to my
son Richard and the half of the Stock if he is alive
and in Case he is Dead, to my son John & appoint
him of the Whole Land and Stock,

Item I give unto my son John Bruce the one half of
the Land or Plantation I now live on and all other
Land or Properties I have a right to, and all the
Household Furniture and Stock in Case Richard is Dead
if he is alive to be as above. To him his Heirs or
Assigns forever. Item I give to my son Robert &
William Bruce & to my Daughter Sarah Robison to
each Twenty Shillings Current money of this State
to them and their Heirs forever. Item in Case John &
Richard Bruce is dead I leave and bequeath my
whole Estate both Real & Personal at my wife's
death to be Divided equally James Bruce & his
Sister Martha and Williams son Thomas Bruce
and Martha Robison and Rachel Robison to them
& their Heirs forever. and I Appoint my son John

and my Wife to be Executrix of this my last Will and
Testament Revoking all other Will or Wills by me
made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and Seal this 1st day of June 1783.

to die Do make Ordain Constitute and Appoint this my
last Will and Testament First of all I give and bequeath
my soul to God who gave it me in hopes that at the Day of
Resurrection he will receive it this his Merits and attorney
blood of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ as for my body
I give it to the earth from whence it came to be decently
buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter appointed
and as for my worldly Estate that it hath Please God before
I give and bequeath as followeth Item I give and bequeath
to my beloved wife Sarah Dosey this Plantation I now live on

Containing one hundred and thirty five Acres. During the Term
of her Woodhouse and all my moveable Properties so long as she
continued a Widow, and if the said Sarah Dofset my beloved
wife should marry, then the two thirds of my movable estate
is to be sole and the money arising from them to be paid out
upon Interest for my two Daughters Lucy and Susannah
Dofset, the Plantation I now live on containing one hundred
and thirty five Acres, at my wifes death I give it to my son
William Dofset. I do allow my said Ex: " herafter name to
put out the remainder of such money for the use of my aforesd
Children upon Interest after my lawful Debts are paid and my
Funeral Expenses. I do hereby appoint Benjamin Davis and
Stephen Dorsett to be my sole Ex: " to this my last Will &
Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand &
affix my seal this 7th Day of December 1783.

hurly made by me I impudic. I recommend my body

to my well beloved wife all my Lands Goods and Chattels
as long as she remains my Widow, and after her Death
or Marriage then I give and bequeath my Lands to be
divided among my sons and all my Sons equally all my
goods and Chattels to be equally divided among my
Widow and my Children and if she Marry then she must
give bond and security for my Children rights to the legacy

H: Sackfield Brund Executrix of this my last Will and
Testament this Twenty fourth day of January 1784
