In the Name of God amen the tenth Day of September
in the Year of our Lord 1768. I Isaac Guason of Orange County in
the Province of North Carolina (Planted) being very sick I came
in Bed, but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given
unto God. Therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make
and Decree this my last will & Testament, that is to say Principally
and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of
God that gave it, and for my body I Recommend it to the Earth
to be buried in a Christian like & Decent manner at the all the
Discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but all the general
Pardon of God, shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
it hath pleased almighty God to bless me in this life
I give devised and Dispose of the same in the following manner
and form. **Imprimis.** I give and bequeath unto Margaret
my dearly beloved Wife two of my best Cow two Cows & one
Barren Heifer, and thirty Bushels of good wheat, five
Bushels of Rye and one hundred and fifty weight of pork
the (wheat Rye) and Pork to be paid yearly to my said
Wife by my son Nicholas, and all my Household Goods
and Furniture during her Natural life and all her
Deceased to be equally Divided amongst my Children.
Item I give to my well beloved Son Isaac Guason
his Horse and shaggs forever, all that Tract or parcel of
Land lying on the West side of Meadors Creek, joining the
Plantation where I now live, and a Part of the Henry Dasher
the Collick in the County aforesaid containing two Acres

Acres of Land be the same more or less by his Heirs & Assigns freely to possess and enjoy forever.

And I do give to my son Nicholas Gueson his Heirs and Assigns all and Singular the Plantation where I now live containing 2 1/3 Acres of Land with all the improvements thereunto belonging by him freely to Possess and Enjoyed, by him and his Heirs and Assigns forever, he paying to his mother, as above Mentioned and to render her two Cows, every winter while she lives, and further I do give to my son Nicholas Gueson, all my Stock of Cattle and Hogs, except what is above mentioned, to his Mother, and likewise all my Housed Furniture, and Ship with all my Utensils of Husbandry, and all Grain in the Barn and Corn in the fields, and all other Benefits rising from my said Plantation freely to be Possessed and Enjoyed by him his Heirs and Assigns forever, and all my outstanding Debts, by him my said Son to Receive and Enjoy as his Property.

And I do further allow that my said son Nicholas pay to my son John Gueson his Heirs and Assigns two thousand Pounds Proclamation Money in five Years after my Decease &c.

I sheweth that my said son Nicholas pay to my son Jack Gueson his Heirs and Assigns the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds Proclamation Money in five Years after my Decease &c.

And also that my said son Nicholas pay to my Daughters Margaret Low and Ursula Lieberburg

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and to Each of them and their Heirs the Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds Proclamation Money, in five Years after my Decease, And I do make Constituted and Ordain my said son Nicholas Gueson, my only and Sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and utterly Disallowing, Revoking, and Disannulling, all and every other former, Testament, Wills, Legacies and Executors, by me or any of me before this time made, uttered and Requeathed, Relieving and Confining this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
