money. Item, I give and bequeath unto Richard Campbell one
negroe girl named Jean now in his care. I give and bequeath
unto my grandson Walter Statten, five Negroe slaves, Rachel, Priscilla,
and Sam, and a copper still, and the plantation whereon I now live are
a negroe man named Joe. Item, I give and bequeath unto my
grandson Walter Statten son Richard Statten, one Negroe boy named Mys.
It is my Will, and I order it so that the lands not bequeathed in
Richmond County when P.D. in the State aforesaid shall be sold, and
likewise my household goods, horses and cattle, and the money equally divided
amongst Mary Moore, Jean Hartley, Elizabeth Levy and Walter Statten.
And lastly I constitute make and ordain Walter Statten my only and sole
Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
