Item I give unto my deatly and well beloved wife Hannah Brazier all my personal Estate consisting of all my goods and Chattels of every kind whatsoever during her widowhood and at her marriage or decease the said personal Estate to be equally divided among my youngest daughter, Mary, Cappa, Jean and Rachel, to be paid them as they marry or come of age. But likewise remember that as my wife is to have the full possession of my personal estate during her widowhood that is to raise the young children and likewise constitute and appoint John Cyle son and William Cox Depts of this my last Will and Testament, and I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every former Will or Legacy or Testament by me heretofore made ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

In the Name of God Amen, the Seventh Day of February 1784, I Richard Lake of the State of North Carolina and County of Orange Farmer, being very sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and memory, thank be given unto god, therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain that my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soule into the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like decent manner, at the discretion of my Executor, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God. and as touch- ing my such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose, of the same in the following man- ner and form: Inprimis It is my Will and I do order, that in the first place, all my Just debts, and funeral Charges be paid & satisfied. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Terry six Negroes Ralph, Carter, Leon, Phillis, Sarah, Davy, during her lifetime, and my Will is that said Negroes after the death of my said daughter shall be equally divided amongst her children which she hath by James Terry, Richard and John excepted, and further my Will is that my daughter Elizabeth Terry aforesaid shall have the use of one negro on an name Dick, during her lifetime, and then to descend to my grandson Richard Lake Terry. Item I leave and bequeath unto my daughter Mary some four Negroes Phil, Love, Carter and Phil, now in her possession her lifetime, then Phil and Jude as man and wife to be sold and out paid and the money to be equally divided among my aforesaid daughter Mary's children. Item I give and bequeath to Richard Lake moore one Negro girl named Carter, now in the care of my said daughter Mary moore. Item I give and bequeath to Richard Lake moore

unto, John King son of Elizabeth King, one negro boy named Phil, now in the care of ^{the} said daughter Mary Moore. Item I give and bequeath unto John Moore one negro boy named Isaac now in his care. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Jean Hanley one negro woman named Hannah. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter, Susannah Campbell two hundred acres of Land named her Inheritance Patent and another hundred acres adjoining to it, and five shillings in money. Item I give and bequeath unto Richard Campbell one negro girl named Jean now in his care. I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Walter Slatten, five negroes, Sam, Rachel, Ben, Jude, and Sam, and a Copper Still, and the plantation whereon said lives are a negro maid named Jo. Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Walter Slatten son Richard Slatten, one negro boy named Mops. It is my Will, and I order it so that the lands not bequeathed in Richmond County upon P.D. in the State aforesaid shall be sold and likewise my household goods, house and kittle, and the money equally divide amongst Mary Moore, Jean Hanley, Elizabeth King and Walter Slatten. And lastly I constitute make and ordain Walter Slatten my only and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, I Witness whereof, these becometh at my hand & seal the day and year above written.

Articles of an Agreement made and concluded this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty three Between Hannah King and William King, both of Orange County & State of North Carolina Executors of the last Will and Testament of John King deceased of the one part And John King, Barton King, Charles King, Nathaniel King, William Blackwood Richard Morris, Anne King and Elizabeth King as well on behalf of themselves as for Obadiah King, Thomas King, Hannah King and Rebecca King, Minors all Legates of the aforesaid last Will & Testament of John King deceased Witnesseth that the said Hannah King and William King doth consent and agree to and with the aforesaid John King, Barton King, Charles King, Nathaniel King, William Blackwood, Richard Morris, Anne King and Elizabeth King to have an equal division of the aforesaid John King deceased agreeable to the Will of which they are Executors, the division to be on the first day of October next, And the said John King, Barton King, Charles King, Nathaniel King, William Blackwood, Richard Morris, Anne King & Elizabeth King, on their part doth agree to build a Commonwealth dwelling house for the aforesaid Hannah King on a spot she shall point out on the land of William King, and allow her the use of a Negro woman as maid & servant during her life and also to let her have in part of her share of the Estate one gang of Hogs at the appraised value. And they do further agree to let the aforesaid William King have one gang of Hogs one still and one feather bed called his own at the appraised value in part of his share of the Estate. and the said John King, Barton King, Charles King, Nathaniel King, William Blackwood, Richard Morris, Anne King & Elizabeth King, doth further agree that before the division of the Estate shall be made that they will enter into sufficient bond before Justice District one of the Legates, and the Guardians, of Thomas King Obadiah King, Hannah King & Rebecca King Minors, to save themselves and
