Twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty four between Alexander Milano esq^r chairman of the County Court of the County of Orange and State aforesaid on behalf of the Justices of the said court and their successors of the one part and John McVinch of the other part witnesseth that the said Alexander Milano esq^r in pursuance of an order of the said County Court made this day of

and according to the direction of the act of Assembly in that case made and provided hath placed and bind unto the said John McVinch
John Riley Esq^r now of the age of two years with the said John McVinch
to live after the manner of an apprentice and servant until the said apprentice shall attain to the age of twenty one years during all which time he said
apprentice his master shall faithfully serve his lawfull commands
every where gladly obey he shall not at any time absent himself
from his said masters service without leave but in all things a good
and faithful servant shall behave towards his said master and the said
John McVinch covenant promises and agree to and with the said Alex^r
Milano that he will teach and instruct or cause to be taught and
instructed the said John Riley to learn the art of a planter or farmer
and that he will constantly feed and provide for the said apprentice during
the term aforesaid sufficient diet washing lodging and apparel fitting
for an apprentice and also all other things necessary both in sickness
and in health in witness whereof the parties to these presents
have interchangably set their hands and seals the day and year

Articles of Agreement made and Executed the 4th day of
June 1783 by and between Joseph Benton who willard Shippard of Wofford
in Orange County and State of North Carolina to wit

The said the said Benton
gives and grants unto the said Willard Shippard the parallell of thirty feet
of land in width from the grantees Roade near the corner of J^d Benton's mill
house to stand upon the mill race to side Shippards land opposite to J^d
Shippards dwelling house for the use and purpose of a Roade and Bridge
across the said mill Run according to the bounds hereafter mentioned viz
beginning in the old Publick Roade near the corner of J^d Bentons mill House
running the west side of J^d Roade or publick Roade at six feet distance from said
Bentons store Stable and Briske house to the south of J^d houses and to continue
in a direct course to J^d Shippards Land to be bridged over width from the
beginning to the end thereof And the said Shippard expressly agrees that
so wide use shall be hereafter made of the said Priviledge abovementioned
as a Roade and Bridge which may hereafter be made in consequence of
the above privilege shall not in any wise injure the Race nor the
priviledge of said Benton and the said Benton and said Shippard land
themselves both these presents their heirs and assigns each other their heirs
and assigns in the sum of One Thousand Pounds for the faithful performance
of the above Articles according to the true intent and meaning of the
same In witness whereof the J^d Benton and J^d Shippard hath hereunto
interchangably set their hands and seals the day and year above
written
