Bequeath unto my well Belov'd Daughter Agnes
Mordash her Cloths one Cow named Brownie and
her fells one Year Lamb Item I give and Bequeath
unto my well belov'd Daughter Janet Mordash
her Cloths and one year schooling one year old
Heifer and her Victuals and Cloths as long as she
lives and works on the place Item I give and
Bequeath unto my well belov'd Son David Mordash
this Part of this Plantation when on grow five
and one year schooling one fow named Puzzy and
his fells and if the Gray mare has a fell he is to
have it Item I give and Bequeath unto my well
Belov'd Son John Mordash one Hundred Acres of
this Plantation when grow five he is to have
schooling at the Discretion of the Executors and
One Year Lamb Item I give and Bequeath unto my
well belov'd Daughter Elizabeth Mordash her
Victuals and Cloths and schooling and Davids fow
fells and falling to mind some things to give amongst
my family I do in the manner following I give
to my wife Elizabeth two barrels and five yards
of striped Linnen One Spring Wheel and a Paul

and three Pairs of saids and one little Rott and to my
son James One Cow one Plough and Irons one Heifer and
Years two Pairs and all my Cloths and Chatt and one Bed
and Bed Cloths a Gallie axe and One a Saddle I give
to fathime one Bed & Bedcloths one Round of fether
one Punch Bowl and one Basin I give Agnes one
Bed and Bedcloths one Round of fether a Bible and
five Yards of striped Linnen I give to my son David
One Plough and Plough Irons one ax and grubbing
One one Broad ax and hand saw and the Auger
I give to my son John one fow named Flower and the
Bay sorrel Horse and Crown Bawls of Flour and the
loom and Chaining Gallow to be sold to pay some
Debts of my land one But fow and Sheep and Hops
two Rats and two Rat ricks and the Gunstone and
several other little articles two tedious to number
for the use of the family and I do here by witness Discharge
Revoke and Disannul all and Every other former
Instrument to wills Agnes and Bequaths and
Executors by me in any wise beponamed Willid and
Bequaths Ratifying and confirming this and no
