 Booth Perry of Granville County in the Province of
 North Carolina, for & in Consideration of the sum
 of Seventy pounds current money of Virginia to me
 in hand paid by Bernard Major of Dinwiddie County
 in the Colony of Virginia, the receipt whereof I do
 hereby acknowledge have bargained sold & made over
 & by these Presents do bargain sell & make over
 unto the said Bernard Major all my Right
 Title & Interest in and to the said three Negro
 Slaves to wit a Female Slave about thirty five
 Years of Age call'd Pathe, a Female Slave about
 thirteen years of Age call'd Sue, & a Negro boy Slave
 about four or five years of Age call'd Ben all which
 Slaves are now in the possession of Agnes Perry Widow
 & relict of Peter Perry late of Dinwiddie County
 deceased. the receipt of which three Slaves after the
 death of the said Agnes Perry being in me the said
 Booth Perry to have & to hold the said three Negro
 Slaves together with the increase of the Female Slaves
 after the decease of the aforementioned Agnes Perry
 to the said Bernard Major his Heirs Executors Administrators
 & Assigns forever Free & Clear and freely & clearly
 discharge of & from all and all manner of lawful
 claim & demand in equity or at Law of me the said
 Booth Perry my Heirs Executors & Administrators or any
 other Person or Persons whomsoever lawfully claiming
 or pretending to claim from by or under me them
 or either of them. In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & Seal the seventeenth day of June, in
 the year of our Lords one thousand seven hundred &
 sixty three

 of North Carolina for & in Consideration of the
 good will & affection that I have and bear unto
 my beloved son Hardy Morgan of the County
 and State aforesaid. have given & Granted and
 by these Presents do give and grant unto the
 said Hardy Morgan his Heirs & Assigns
 forever. Four Negroes nam'd Raph, Pharaoh
 Jude & Rege, and their increase, and all the
 money that I have in hand with all my stock
 of Horse hinds, Cattle, Sheep & Hogs, and
 all my household Furniture with all the
 moveables therunto or belonging to the homestead
 Plantation where I now live on, as a free gift
 to him the said Hardy Morgan his Heirs and
 assigns, against all Persons whatsoever shall
 & will warrant & forever defend by these
 Presents. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand & Seal this 15th day of January 1780
