Just Debt, Funeral Expenses, be duly paid & Satisfied
as I do give & Bequeath unto my son Anthony, the sum
& savings to my Daughter Elizabeth & Anne Phillipine
the sum of five Shillings Lawful money of Pennsylvania
apiece I having already received & paid to each of them
several sums of money & sundry Gifts, & I do give & Bequeath
unto my son John the sum of fifty pounds Lawful money
of Pennsylvania aforesaid & I give & Bequeath unto my
son Jacob the sum of Sixty two pounds ten Shillings
Lawful money of Pennsylvania aforesaid which said two
several sums of money I mean now in the hands of
Henry Boddy & Adam Boddy & I have there two several
Orders for the same bearing Date Respectively the the
Twenty first Day of February 1761, 1762 as far & concerning
all the rest of my Estate both Personally Wholesome &
Wholesome I do give, & devise the same unto my said
sons John & Jacob, their heirs & Assigns forever to be
Equally Divided between them part and share alike of
this my last Will & Testament. I do hereby appoint
my said sons John & Jacob Executors for Wills.

Government, after I shall Receive the Respected money
due on the said two several Bonds or any of them, Now I
do promise to pay or Cause to be paid unto the said
Adam Mowbray his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns
all the monies that I shall Receive & Receive for & on
account of the said Charles Bond On Witness whereof

household goods, may be passed by me, here be given

in the Windsor hands as the Children come at
age be given it in my Deeds that my son William
pay to my son John five pounds current Money & I
give unto my son John out of a miller's note that he
now owes me with, as his Right we have no further Right
