Allen have bargained sold & delivered in plain and open market unto James Neal of this County a Negro man named Tom for the consideration of one hundred pounds specie to me in hand paid by the said Neal before the sealing and delivering of said Tom writing which said Negro I warrant and forever defend from myself and every other person whomsoever as witness my hand & seal this 20th day of May 1787 in presence of us

I Matthew Shepherd of Orange County esq. In consideration of one hundred and seventy pounds to me in hand paid by John Williams esq. of Chatham County at & before the sealing and delivering of these presents the said John Williams acknowledged and thereof do acquit release and defend forever unto John Williams his heirs Executors and Administrators for use to him his heirs Executors and Administrators and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver unto the said John Williams his heirs Executors and Administrators and assigns two Negro women an Slave named Mary (old) and one young girl named Anne his daughter of the said Mary which said child the age of three years and the said John Williams do for himself his heirs Executors and assigns in body warrant the said Slave her and each of them to the said John Williams his heirs Executors and assigns and assigns forever all persons whomsoever and that the said Slave and each of them are and is and lawfully be and free from every kind of servitude and full Intemperance of the said Matthew Shepherd

A Deed of Gift from James Finnan of Orange County State of North Carolina to Robert Finnan his son To all persons whom it may concern. We it be known that James Finnan of the State and County aforesaid for and in consideration of duty to me shown by my son Robert Finnan do think it proper to give and bequeath to and Robert Finnan my Great offshoot in which I now live and my Negro fellow Slaves, but neither of these to be in his full possession till after my death But after my death the same to be the property of of said Robert Finnan his heirs and assigns forever only I owe Robert Finnan at my death to pay the sum of thirty pounds to him it shall be left in my last Will and Testament in which Deed of Gift I do bind myself my heirs and assigns forever by these presents. Seal with my seal hole with my Seal and signed the fourth day of October 1787. Mr Robert Finnan is to have the whole benefit of the plantation and make what improvements he shall think proper his
