William Pigott of Orange County and Province of North Carolina the Ninth
Day of the Second month Commonly Called February in the year of our Lord one
thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty being Proved in Body of Testator mind and
Memory Certified by God ~ and knowing that it is Appropriate for all men once to
Die I do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament and as touching such
Widely Estate as it holdeth I give to God with in this I give to my
Daughters in the following Manner. First I ordain and constitute
Gormack Pigott and Benjamin Pigott to be my only sole Executors of this
my Last Will and Testament. I allow my Funeral Charges and just Debts to be
First Paid out of my Estate. Then I give and devise to my Eldest Son John
Pigott and youngest Son William Pigott all that Part of Land Brought of
Richard Hendren lying and being in the said County of Orange and on the
Middle Fork of Roanoke River a Part of the Land of Thomas Ransom kind
to be divided between them two in this manner. I allowing that Part of the said Land
to be divided by a straight North and South Line along the Tract Providing all
ways I allow my Eldest Son John to have Fully Across the road and along for
him my said Son John to have his Choice in the divide and for the same to be
Equally Divided and Reserved by both my two Sons their Heirs and Assigns forever
After I am dead I give and devise to my second Son James Pigott and third Son
Gormack Pigott all this Part of Land wherein I now die to be equally divided
between them both by an East & West Line a Bridge and for my Son Samuel
to have the upper Improved Part of the Land Including my Building and
Land yard the same to be freely Enjoyed and Reserved by them my said
Two Sons Samuel and Gormack their Heirs and Assigns forever
Also I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah one third of all my
Personal Estate as it was when I died and bequeath to my beloved Wife
Sarah Reserves of the Land and Improvement when she dies
During her Widewhood or otherwise. After I am dead I give and devise to my
Six Daughters namely, Abigail, Margaret, Sarah, Maria,
Elizabeth and Rachel all the remainder Part of my Personal
Estate

I state to be Equally divided amongst them, also allowing three youngest Sons of Samuel, Jonathan and William to Advertise each of them Two Pounds a Year to make a Stacks of Fifteen Pounds to be Equally Divided amongst my aforementioned five Daughters where they Come to age to Enjoy the same.

In the Name of God amen I James Talbot of the Parish of St. Matthews and County of Orange being of sound Mind and perfect Memory thank God for the same do make constitute and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following In witness I recommend my Soul into the hands of my God created and blessed Preseruer and my Body to the Earth to be decently Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and at to what worldly Estate where with it has pleased God to bless me with after Payment of my just Debts and Funeral Charges I give and bequeath as I desire

I intent by this last bequeath unto my Wife Mary this Bearer Testimony also it is my desire that my Father and Mother should not be disturbed from that Place of Earth on which they now lie during their Lives Item and as to my other Estate I leave it to the discretion of my Executors whereof they will See it is well set and divide the Money in Two Equal Parts to my Wife and two Children
Item I direct it is my desire that my three Sons and one Daughter should have & holden at the Discretion of my Executors if either of them should die it is my desire that the real of his share should be equally divided among the rest But it further known my desire is that the Son John may be bound to his Uncle Joseph to Learn the Taylors Trade at the age of fifteen years old Also my Son Benjamin I desire be bound to him at the age of Seven years to serve him twenty Years & to have the sum of £100 per Annum during the time of his service And as to my last Will and Testament I do add and Appoint my loving Brothers Abraham Miles and George Lee to be my executors and to do all Preserving and making Good all the Wills, Testaments or no man's and Ratifying and Confirming this my last Will and Testament as aforesaid in Testament form I have caused set my hand & affixed my Seal this 5th day of October A.D. 1769
