Hunt his heirs & assigns for ever fully & quietly peaceably & entirely without any contradiction claim disturbance of any person whatsoever. And I Philip Pendleton for myself heirs Executors and administrators do warrant and defend the said Negroe against the claim of all persons whatever as witness I seal this 12 day of July Anno Domini 1786
