The twenty Seventh Day of February in the Year of our Lord 1764
 I David Pinter of North Carolina in the County of Orange and Parish
 of Saint Matthews yeoman Being Very Sick and Weak in Body
 Out of Perfect mind and memory that I be given unto god
 therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and
 Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say
 principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul
 unto the hands of god that gave it and for my Body I commend
 it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner
 at the discretion of my Executors Nothing Doubting but at the
 General Resurrection I shall Receive the Same again by the
 mighty power of god and as Touching such worldly Estate
 which with it hath pleased god to bestow on me in this life I give
 Devise and Dispose of the Same in the following Manner
 and form I inwitness it is my will and I do Order that in the
 first place all my Just Debts and funeral Charges be Paid
 and Satisfied - Item I give and Bequeath unto Margaret my dearly
 Beloved wife the Bay Farming More and his Ladder House together
 with his Wood and Wood lotte and his Maintenance ^{out} of the Estate
 During her life if she do not Marry but a if she should
 Marry let her next Husband provide for her Item I give to
 my wife Rebecca son John Pinter the Shellen with the whole
 Main and Tail Item I give to my two Sons William and
 David Pinter their Divis and Apports for Ever all my
 Plantation when on I now dwell to be as Equally divided
 Between them as Rebecca Item I give to my daughter Martha
 An Round Proclamation Money and the little Black Mare
 when she comes to the Age of Eighteen Years and her

Maintenance of the Plantation untill she is otherwise
 Provided for Item I give to my Daughter Mary Pinkerton
 Ten Pounds Proclamation Money and the Horse that is
 called his own when she comes to the age of Eighteen years
 and her Maintenance of the Plantation untill she is
 other ways Provided for Item I give to my eldest Daughter
 Joseph Truckey five Shillings Sterling and it is my will that the
 Stock shall be for the Maintenance of the family and amending
 of the lands and lastly I constitute Make and Ordain my wife
 Margaret and my son John Pinkerton my only and sole
 Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby
 utterly revoke and Disannul all and Every other
 former Testaments wills Legacies and Executors by me in
 any wise before this time named Wills & Bequeathments
 Ratifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last
 will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand & seal the day and year above written
 Signed Sealed Published Pronounced
 and Delivered by the said David
 Pinkerton as his last will and
 Testament

 the Eighteenth day of April 1778 I David Pinkerton of the County
 of Orange being Sick and weak in Body but in perfect mind and
 Memory thanks be to god then gave falling to mind the Mortality
 of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men
 Once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament
 that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend
 my Soul into the hands of Almighty god that gave it and
 my Body I recommend to the Earth to be Buried in a decent
 Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing
 Doubting But at the General Resurrection I shall Receive
 the Same Again by the Mighty Power of god and as touching
 such worldly Estate where with it hath pleased god to bless me in this
 life I give demise and dispose of the Same in the following manner
 and form and first I give and Bequeath to Rachel my worthy
 Beloved wife two hundred Acres of Land which I have or her left
 time & also all my Household goods & Chattels & movables to Ruse
 and maintain the Children until such times as they shall come of
 Age &c also I give to my well beloved son Samuel Pinkerton
 whom I also constitute make Ordain to him two hundred
 Acres of Land lying & being on this now inhabited by Humphrey
 Barnell together with his Man and Lady &c and also
 I give to my well beloved Daughter Mary Nash Barnell whom
 I also will constitute and give the Sum of ten Pounds Proclamation Money
 to each of them &c and if the Child that my wife is with
 child be a Daughter and should live it shall be also shared
 with the Rest and get Ten Pounds Equal to my other Daughters
 which money shall be lived and raised of the Estate &c lest
 it be a Son he shall have two hundred Acres of Land at
 his Mothers Death lying on James Creek that I now live on
 together with a Horse and Saddle Equal to Samuels
