Lewis to have that part where one Isaac live
Also give and bequeath to my beloved son William Thomas
one Shilling Sterling to him and his heirs only for two uses
Also give & bequeath to my beloved son James Thomas one
Shilling Sterling. I Also give & bequeath to my beloved son
George Thomas one Shilling Sterling. I Also give and
bequeath to my beloved son Miles Thomas one Shilling Sterling
I Also give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary one
Shilling Sterling. I Also give & bequeath to my beloved Daughter
Sarah Wicks one Shilling Sterling to them and their heirs
only for two uses
And if any of these my six small children should die
without have lawfully begotten of their Body their Part shall be
Equally divided amongst my yet remaining young children
And thereby appoint my two beloved friends John Green

and Thomas Gate son of Robert my full and sole Executors of this

& Requests by me made and Declaring this only to be my last will

One Cow & Calf to him & his heirs for ever & ever

I give & dispose unto my Loving Wife Cornfast
Record all the Rest of my Estate that I now possess both
Real & Personal and also my Will & desire is that my
Wife should enjoy & possess all the afore mentioned
Gifts Enduring her Natural Life Time or widowhood
Forthways (when her Death or Marriage) that the afore
mentioned Gifts should Remain and the Rest of my
Estate should be Equally divided amongst my Children
My Wife Cornfast Record & Cornfast Prantly I desire
to have Executors of this my last Will & Testament.

whereon I now live with one Hundred & Twenty Acres beginning
at said line between my land and George Womans land running
a North line to my back line for complement also I have to my
son Thomas Pelly one Cow & Calf to be delivered to him at his Twenty
Age Also I give to my other two sons Reuben & John Pelly the
Remainder part of my land Equally to be divided by a line East
& West also to my two sons Reuben & John Pelly I have a Cow
& Calf to be delivered to them when of age, also my Will is
if either these my sons Reuben John or Thomas Pelly should
decease before they come of Age their lands & Cattle shall fall
to the other two sons then living Also my Will & desire is that
my well beloved wife Mary Pelly shall have the use of my
Plantation during her widowhood also the use of my Household
Goods also my Will is that my Daughter Martha
Pelly shall receive of my Estate Three pounds at her Marriage
or Death of my wife Mary Pelly further my Will is that
at the Marriage or Death of my well beloved wife Mary
Pelly that the remainder part of my ~~land~~ Stock & Household
Goods to be Equally divided amongst my Children then
a live including my three sons Reuben John & Thomas
Pelly also my Will is if my well beloved wife Mary
Pelly should decease before my Children shall be of age
