and Attorneys under him for the purposes aforesaid to appoint and at his pleasure to make such appointments and nominate others in their stead, giving and hereby granting unto the said William Blount as full power and Authority in the premises to all intents and purposes as I if present could exercise and hereby ratifying and confirming whatsoever he shall do or cause to be done therein by virtue of these presents in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3. day of May A. D. 1784.
