and by Presents so fully and clearly and absolutely Bargain &
sell unto the said John Broth all my Right of my Father's
Estate that falls to me after my Mother's death of both land
and Negroes and every thing else to have and to hold the said
Estate to the said John Broth his Heirs Executors Adminis^r

against all People, shall and will Warrant August and forever
defend. In witness I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this 27th day of August 1781.

after my death. I say the third part of the Estate of Paul

Hogs and Sheep, household Furniture and all other small menparies
that is in being at this time, this Dec^r shall stand good in Law
and shall be Record in this County Court. This Dec^r of
Gift made by me this day is to keep any Person or Persons
from taking of any of this Estate for any Debt due or Demanded
Contracted by Paul Capellbury Deced^t or to third Guaranties, his wife
death. I say signs Seals and Deliver in the Presence of
Thomas Roberts, Joseph Capellbury, Susanah Capellbury
