that is to say first I recommend my Soul to God who
gives it Nothing doubting but that at the General Resurrec-
tion, I shall receive the same again, by the mighty power
of God through Jesus Christ, I leave this whole World & move-
ment thereof to be loved, & more as I have any
Worldly Estate, that it hath pleased God to give me
I give & Dispose of in manner & Form following.

First, To my dear & beloved wife Sarah
Agnes, the one third of all I possess, & her life & for so long
as she shall live, & after her death I leave to be divided
the third of my Estate, the rest I Dispose of in the manner
& Form following, I give & divide all after my wife
dies, Equally amongst my four Children, to wit my
Elizabeth, Samuel & William, them to have equal Shares
after my dear & beloved wife's Expenses is paid by my
Children hereafter named, & I do constitute &

Ordain my dear & beloved wife Sarah, & James
Threlkeld my whole sole Executors of this my last
Will & Testament, Respecting & following all
Wills heretofore made, published or declared by
me, allowing this only to be my last Will &

Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand the 26th Day of March in the Year

In the Name of God amen. I Charles Calverley
of the County of Durham, the son of William Calverley (Seal)
being very weak & sick of Body, but of perfect mind & sound
Memory, I make to God Calling to mind the
Mortality, to die & after death to come to Judgment -
do make & Ordain this my last will & Testament that
is to say that I do give & Dispose of all I give &
Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God
that gives it and my Body I Recommend to the
Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the
Discretion of my Executors, Nothing doubting but
that at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty power of God, and as touching
my worldly Estate, wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me, in this life I give & Dispose of
the same in the following manner & Form
First I give & Recommend to my dear & beloved wife
Sarah, living in the County of Durham a large
Tract or the North part of the Estate I have
I have & leave James Calverley, containing nine
Hundred & sixty Acres to be Equally divided among
all my Children being living in the said County of Durham

I cannot agree amongst themselves to be divided by Lots & if any of them, when's D^y is before they come of Age to inherit some thing part to be Equally divided among the Living). Also I have to and taken my Beloved Wife's certain Improvement or part of said Living in the County of Colony of aforesaid Living & Building. Situate on and near a Branch of New River which I allow to be partitioned by my Executors out of my Personal Estate for the use & support of my Wife - During her Natural life or after her Decease - to be done to my Youngest Child then living - I likewise have the improvement I now live on to be sold, by my Executors, & the money to go to my Wife, for to Support her & my Children.

Also I give & bequeath unto my well Beloved Daughter Catharine, one Little Maid five Years old

Also I leave unto my Beloved Wife two Week wages & what she likes & settles who may think proper to keep for the Support of her Young Children, & the Demand to be paid at Widow's & the money to go to educate the Children.

The Remainder of my Movable Effects & Stock of Sheep & Hogs I have to Support, or Reared the Family, & to be divided amongst the Children as they grow of age - as my Wife think proper, and receiving as she is able to be paid. I also order my Beloved Son & heirs to be put to School & two Years & the Cost of his Schooling to be paid out of Personal Estate. The Remainder of my Personal Estate as before mentioned, I have to my Beloved Wife, to Support her & to rear my Children. During her Natural life, or Widowhood & after her Decease her Marriage what is left, to be Equally divided amongst all my Children. I also bequeath bequeaths unto her & to be done my trusty & well beloved friend John Buchanan, of Augusta County in Virginia with my Beloved Wife, my Executors of this my last Will & Testament to settle my Affairs

in that Province or Colony, and so also bequeaths Appoint and Assign, my trusty friend George Boone with my Beloved Wife my Executors to settle my Affairs in the Province of Va so truly Willely, I do allow & bequeath & bequeath all and every other former Testament with & Legacies, Bequests & Residues, in any wise before, named & Willely & Residues - Ratifying & Confirming, this & the other, to be my last Will & Testament, I am Witness, when of I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 5th Day of June in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred & thirty
