In the Name of God amen I James Talbot of the Parish of St. Matthews and County of Orange being of Sound Mind and perfect Memory thanks be to God for the same do make Constitutions and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and Form following I hereby recommend my Soul into the hands of my God Creator and Redeemer and my Body to the earth to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named and as to what worldly Estate with which it has pleased God to bless me with after Payment of my Just Debts and Funeral Charges I give and bequeath as follows

I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Mary this Bed and Furniture also it is my desire that my Father and Mother should not be disturbed from that Piece of Land on which they now Live during their Lives & then and as to my other Estate I leave it to the discretion of my Executors without they will ^{divide} it as sell it and divide the Money into Two Equal Parts to my Wife and Two Children

I Give and bequeath it is my desire that my three Sons and one Daughter should have a Shilling at the Discretion of my Executors & if either of them should die it is my desire that the share of the Child should be equally divided amongst the other three & it further known my desire is that Eliza and John may be bound to his Uncle Joseph to learn the Taylor Trade at the age of fifteen years old also my Son Benjamin & Sarah be bound to him at the age of 17 years & my Son Joseph be bound to him at the age of 17 years & my Son William be bound to him at the age of 17 years and lastly of this my Last Will and Testament I Ordain and Appoint my Loving Brother Nathaniel Miles and George Lee to be my whole and sole Executors and making void all other Wills herebefore by me made and Ratifying and Confirming this my Last Will and Testament as aforesaid in Testament whereby I have hereunto set my hand & Affixed my Seal this 5th Day of October 1769
