is to say Principally. At first of all I command my selfe
into the hand of God that gave it & for my Body I command
I unto the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like & decent
manner at the Discretion of my Executors without Distressing
but that at the General Resurrection I shall rise the same
again by the mighty power of God & so touching such worldly
Goods wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this
life I give & bequeath of all the following manner —
I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth I give & bequeath
the half of my Estate after my deuise & honest Debts and paid —
Item I give & bequeath unto my son Richard the Plantation
whereon he now livs after his mothers Decease —
Item I give & bequeath unto my Dafford Sarah the 1/2
wherowen she now lyeth Item I nominate my Grand Dafford
and the Dafford of my son Thomas to have an equal part of
my Estate with my son Richard & I do nominate &
Appoint my son Thomas & Richard to be my Executors of
my Estate according to my D^ress —

In the name of God amēn. I of right W^m Gold of Orange —
County North Carolina being in a weak state of health but
in perfect sense and memory do make & execute —
this my last will & Testament revoking & deannulling all
former wills and Testaments by me heretofore made —
Item I make & declare of all I command my Soul into the hands
of Almighty God who first gave it me. & my Body to the
Earth to be decently Buried at the Direction of my Executors
hereafter mentioned. hoping through the merits of my
beloved Saviour and Redemeer Jesus Christ of a joyful
Resurrection on the last day and as for what worldly Estate I
hath pleased Almighty God to bestow me with I give and bequeath
as follows viz Item I give and bequeath to my son John
W^m and D^r Gold Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Mary
Snowthorpe and D^r Gold Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter —
Cannah W^m and D^r Gold Item I give and bequeath to my —
Daughter Elizabeth Tally and D^r Gold Item I give & bequeath unto
my son James W^m three Negroes viz Nancy Roger & Will
after my Wifes Decease by the said James W^m paying to Joseph
Snowthorpe my grand son ten pounds current money of Georgia also
I give & bequeath unto my son James W^m the lower part of the
Land wherowen I now live to him and his heirs forever the said
Land to be divided by a straight line running from the mouth
of a branch below the root of a tree to the head of a branch that
makes in against a hand in little River also and feather bed
& furniture and all the remaining part of my stock that as not other
ways disposed of in my will after all my Lawful Debts and
Expenses are paid Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter
Lucy Powell two Negroes viz Moll & old Jenny also the number
of the land that I have out to her & her Heirs forever and also one
feather bed and furniture paid over & to the heirs above named —

Spice morter, one Iron pot and pater plates our box.
Iron and beaten one large pater Dish my Wifes
Riding Saddle & bridle to be hers after my wifes Decease
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daugther Sarah
Fountain and Negro Girl named Jenny to be hers after
my wifes Decease. — Item I give & bequeath unto my
Living wife Sarah Wade, all the Revenue of my Estate
both real & personal, during her life, and that she may
not be married, on the Plantation wherent I now live so long
as she shall live. Item I appoint my son James Wade
& my son in law Joseph Dowd Executors of this my last
Will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & seal this third day of January one thousand
two hundred & fifty two.

In the Name of God amen. I David Wallerton
of Orange County and Province of North Carolina, being weak
in Body but of sound Minety, thanks be to god but not —
knowing how soon thow may be changed to this third Day of
January in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven
Hundred and Forty Two, do make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following
that is to say. First I command my Executore to Inherit
the house of Almighty God, that giveth living, through the
works of my Beloved Redeemer to inherit life everlasting
and as to my mortal body, I commit it to Earth from

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where it was taken to be at the Division of my Estates hertofore
mentioned. Item I give slaves and Bequests my Living wife
(after my debts is paid) the Plantation wherent I now dwelt also my
two Negroe, Sam and Dick and all that is upon or Belonging
to the said Plantation. During her wedlocke or life I desire
that no more land may be cleared over the Creek but of this Side
also I desire that each of them what they come of Age shall have
a New Suit of Clother at 10 pounds ten Shillings Virginia
Money, Dose and a new Saddle and Harness or Mere at 10 pounds
Pound Virginia Money the Saddle at two pounds five Shillings
Lb. money, and my son Charles which is now a boy and
if he remains so shall have good Learning if he will be able
to Receive it and have his full Board upon the Plantation, his
Mother's Age. At my wifes Death or Marriage I desire that
my Land and Negroe shall be Divided among my
children as followeth. I except my wife is now with Child &
if it comes to Postition and is a boy I give and Bequest unto
it one Hundred acres of Land on the east side of the Creek —
Joining the North Side with the Dwelling house on it —
Item I give unto my son Charles one hundred & thirty acres
of Land at Upper Joining the upper line and upon both sides
of the Creek. Item I give unto my son Thomas one hundred
and forty acre of Land joining the Lower land & West land
I leave my Land upon the Creeked forth to be Equally
Divided, between my sons Son David, John and William
according to Quantity & Quality, and the Child before mentioned
should prove a girl. I give no land but an Equal share of the
rest of my Estate with Clother Harness & Sodals according to
the Boys, and a horse to have his part wher the Dwelling
house stands and William to have that part of Land that
Thomas was to have and the Creeked forth to be equally
Divided between my two Sons David & John according to
Quantity
