Carolina (Widow hath Issue with one Phillip Mowbray
 of the City of Pennsylvania, in the Province of Pennsylvania
 & Shropshire, two certain Bonds from Henry & Adams Bury
 to the said Adam Mowbray bearing Date respectively the
 21st Day of February 1761. the one of them being for fifty
 Pounds, payable the tenth of May 1765. & the other of
 them being payable for forty two pounds ten Shillings
 payable the tenth May 1766 and whereas the said Adam
 Mowbray by his letter of Attorney, bearing even Date
 herewith, did authorize & empower, me the Subscriber to
 receive the money on the two several Bonds as the Bond and
 Date, in order that I may pay the same to the said Adam
 Mowbray his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns at my
 Government, after I shall receive the Respective monies
 due on the said two several Bonds or any of them, Now I
 do promise to pay or cause to be paid unto the said
 Adam Mowbray his heirs Executors Administrators or assigns
 all the monies that I shall receive & receive for & on
 account of the said Charles Bond On Witness whereof
 the I, Philip Mowbray have hereunto set my hand & Seal the
 fourth Day of August 1763

Be it known unto all men that John Mowbray
 of Orange County in the Province of North Carolina
 is appoint this to be my last Will & Testament & that
 is to say, In my own Will and I give unto my son William
 a plantation (containing) one hundred & thirty five acres
 lying on the south side of Little River, all the Land
 that pertains to me I give to my son Richard
 one hundred acres at the head of New Branch to be taken
 off out of my land, this plantation I give to my
 son Simon one hundred acres lying at the lower end
 to be taken of one hundred three plantations, And it is
 I give my Deeds, that my son David, when he have
 the plantation I give him, I have appointed my
 Loving wife my Executor, With the help of my sons
 William, & I in my Deeds that all my movable &
 household Goods, may be passed by me, here I give
 & that every Child as it comes of age to have its part
 of according to the promise, and all to be paid
 in the Windsor hands as the Children come at
 age I have it in my Deeds that my son William
 pay to my son John five pounds current Money & I
 give unto my son John out of the same Land that he
 now works with, as his Right we have no further Right
