Body to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the
Discretion of my heirs &c and aske my worldly Substance should God
has been pleased to bestow on me I do despatch of it in manner and
form following first I leave to my son Theol. Donelson two
Shillings Sterling having given him before largely of his Marriage
also I leave to my daughter Margarett wife to William Day
Two Shillings Sterling besides what she got at her Marriage and
I leave to my Daughter Mary only Two Shillings Sterling and
that is to much I leave to my Daughter Hannah her horse and
a Horse and Saddle to be worth Ten Pounds Virginia Money
my Land to my son Robert Donelson at his Mother's death or
at his Marriage the wife of my two Negroes to my wife and one
of the Plantation she leaving this rest of my children and schooling
and Bleaching them till they are all of age to follow my living
Ninth the third of all my Personal Estate and to Elizabeth Dean.

Further Sarah & Robert Dallow each of them are equal Heirs of
the Remained of my Estate either Goods Chattels Money Due
and the two Negroes above mentioned Each a Horse and Saddle
to my son Robert out of the whole & my body as he is to be for
the use of the Family without being Valued and I nominate my
Negro Hannah Donelson & Mrs Day to be my Executor & The Donelsons
and I jointly & confirm this to be my last Will & Testament in witness
whereof I set my hand & seal this 20 Day of August 1770

the Province of North Carolina being full and Well in Body but of perfect
mind and Memory thanks be given to God therefore leaving to make the
Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to
Die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament Principally and
First of all I give and Bequeath my Precious and Immortal soul into the
hands of God that gave it me and as for my Body I command it to the earth to be
Buried in a Christian like and decent Manner and at the discretion of my
Executors whom hereafter I shall appoint nothing troubling but at my natural
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God and
as Touching such worldly Estate wherewithal I am blessed God to bestow me
in this life After my just Debts and Taxes I give devise & dispose of the same
as followeth WIT: I M PRIMIS I give and bequeath to my beloved son
William Yarbrough that Tract of Land lying in Amelia County wherein
his Grand Father formerly lived Aysen between East and Westway
and Likewise a certain Tract of Land lying on East River belonging
to Robert Bumpas to him and his heirs forever. Item I bind to my
beloved wife Sarah Yarbrough the Plantation wherein I now dwell
and the Part of Land belonging thereto for and during my Natural
Life as her husband. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son Samuel
Yarbrough the one half of the Tract of Land now lies on the lower end
thereof

Thereof but not disturbing or hindring his Mother to come in
his Years forever Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son Edm
Ogarnough the other Half of the said Land app'd and thereof not dictioring
or hindring his Mother on the abovv Conditions to him and his Heirs forever
Item my Will and desire is that that Piece of Land that I removed from
lying on both sides of Malbys Creek Assigning to the Trustee
to my son William be sold and the money to come into the movalte of the
Item my Will and desire is that my son William Yarborough have one
Negro Man Named Hannah but not to be remoued nor no share
to be taken by him for his insuing year to him the same forever
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son Samuel Yarborough all his
Arriving to the year of Twenty one one Negro Boy named Joe to him the same forever
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son John Yarborough one Negro
Man Named Sheperd at his leving to the year of Twenty one and the same forever
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Yarborough
One Negro Girl Named Rachel at her arriving to the year of eighteen or at
the Day of her Marriage to her and her Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath
to my beloved Daughter Sarah Yarborough one Negro Boy Named Lewis
at her arriving to the year of eighteen or at the Day of her Marriage to her and her Heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Lucy Yarborough one
Negro Girl Named Anatole at her arriving to the year of eighteen or
at the Day of her Marriage to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife one Negroe Woman But to her the same forever
And also I ordinate her to have a Negro a man Named Sam and a
Woman Named Lucy for and as long as she continues a widow but and if
she Marries then have two to be equally divided amongst the children
Item my Will and desire is that my beloved Wife have the use and
dispossession of all Stock at her discretion and likewise all my Household
Furniture
