The Emotion of the last will & Testament of
Enoch Davis was duly proved in Open Court
by the Oaths of Nathaniel Harrell & Henry
Harris the two subscribing witnesses, and
Ordered to be Recorded

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Davis of
Orange County and state of North Carolina being
sick and weak but of perfect Mind and Memory be-
sied be God. Giving to mind the mortality of my
body and knowing that it is appointed that all men
die. I resign my soul to almighty God who gave it
My body to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian
Burial at the discretion of my Executors and all
what worldly substance God hath blessed me
with I dispose of in the following manner

Item Whereas I have heretofore and conveyed to my
son in law John Hogan by Deed bearing date the
seventeenth day of July one thousand seven hundred
and eighty five all that Tract or parcel of
Land and premises whereon I now live containing
by estimation three hundred twenty nine

acres more or less also all that Tract or parcel of
Land and premises situate lying and being in the
County aforesaid known by the name of the meadow
Tract Containing by estimation six hundred &
three acres be the same more or less. Also five
Negroes to wit, Leamy, Hannah Jack Peter
and Harry and as some dispute may arise at
my Death Respecting the Lawfulness or
Regality of the said Conveyance. I do hereby
give bequeath and devise the said two Tracts of
Land and the said five Negroes to my said
son in Law John Hogan to him and his heirs
forever —

I also give and bequeath to my said son
in Law John Hogan my Waggon and Gen also
my sorrel Horse mory to him and his
heirs for ever also I spare of hand Irons and all
my stock of Hogs —

Item Whereas I have heretofore made over and conveyed
to my son Thomas Lloyd a certain Tract or
parcel of Land known by the name of Barber's Tract
and two Negroes To wit Will and Ned during
his natural Life and after his decease come

Grand son Thomas Hogan and in case any
dispute should arise after my decease respecting
the said Conveyance. I hereby give bequeath and
Devise the said Land and two Negroes in man-
ner and form as is preferred in the said deed to them
either of them and heirs for ever —

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Hogan
Negro man named Jeff one feather Bed and furniture
one large Iron Pot and all my Potter consisting of
Bason one Dish and Jettun plates to her and her heirs
forever —

Item I give and bequeath to my son Frederick Lloyd
one feather Bed the third best bed I posses also
one Cow and calf one two year heifer and one two
year old steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I give and bequeath to my son in Law John Lloyd
one Cow and calf one two year old heifer and one
year old steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I give and bequeath to my son in Law John Lloyd
one Cow and calf one two year heifer and one two year
old steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I give bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Lloyd
one feather Bed one bed and bedstead

Grand son Thomas Hogan and in case any dispute should arise after my decease respecting the said Conveyance. I hereby Give bequeath and Devise the said Land and two Negroes in man and form as is prep'd in the said deed to them either of them and heirs for ever —

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Hogan a Negro man named Jeff one feather Bed and furniture one large Iron Pot and all my Pewter Consisting of

Bacon one Dish and eight Plates to her and her heirs for ever —

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Frederick Lloyd one feather Bed the third best bed Spoke's also one Cow and calf one two year heifer and one two year old steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I Give and bequeath to my son in Law John Hall one Cow and calf one two year old Heifer and one year old Steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I Give and bequeath to my son in Law John Hall one Cow and calf one two year heifer and one two year old steer to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I Give bequeath to my Grandson Thomas Lloyd one Cow and calf and one yearling to him

and his heirs for ever — I Give and bequeath unto my Grandson Thomas Hogan one horse named Jack on good the Gear and three head of Cattle to him and his heirs for ever also two Cows and a Lamb —

I Give and bequeath to my Grandson John Hogan one feather Bed and furniture to the second best young to him and his heirs for ever also two Cows and a Lamb I Give and bequeath to my Grandson William Hogan my Desk to him and his heirs for ever —

I Give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Margaret Lloyd Hogan two traps Cattle sticks and two sad Irons and one Walnut coaliding Table also two Cows and a Lamb to her and her heirs for ever —

I Give and bequeath to my Grandson James Hogan one Copper Kettle and Woven to him and his heirs for ever —

I Give and bequeath to my Grandson Alexander Hogan my Home Spade and Hangers to him and his heirs for ever —

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Hogan my Bible together with all the Furniture and good household furniture

and last of all I constitute and appoint my

Grandson John Hogan and Basil King Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby bearing the all other Wills Whose my hand and seal I give
