I do hereby ordain and appoint my beloved wife the sole Executrix of this my last will and testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul, all and every other former wills and testaments legacies bequeaths and Executors by me in any wise before named written & bequeathed.

Then I leave and bequeath unto my youngest Daughter Elizabeth two Negroe wenchs Phill & Phillis, and if she have no child I allow her to be married at the age of sixteen that she may may be made equal to Phillis or value
