 I wish it to be equally divided between my Daughter
 Elisabeth and my grand son William Long
 to my moveable estate I allow it to be equally
 divided between my wife Agnes & my Daughter
 Elisabeth and I do hereby appoint and Ordain
 John Hart son of James Hart to be my lawful
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 and I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul
 other Legacies Wills & Testaments made by me
 therefore ratifying and confirming this to be
 my last will and Testament In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
 day of August 1787

Orange County Inquisition indented and taken at the
 plantation of William King in the County aforesaid
 the 9th of June 1788 before me John Taylor Esquire coron-
 er of said County upon view of the Body of Daniel McGarity
 a Child of John McGarity late of the County aforesaid
 and there lying Dead and upon the Oath of John Hagan
 Nathaniel King Docten King Samuel Craig Charles King
 Robert Baker James Blackwood John King Stephen Long
 John Strain Joseph Kirkland & William King good and
 lawful men of the Parish of Saint Matthews the said
 County of Orange who being charged & sworn to enquire
 and in what manner the said Daniel McGarity by
 his death came upon them Do they do say whose names
 and seals are hereunto subscribed and annexed being
 duly summoned sworn on an inquest held the 9th
 day of June 1788 at the house and plantation of
 William King on the Body of Daniel McGarity
 a Child of John McGarity supposed to have
 died of the abuse he received of Rachel Cooper
 after examining all the Testimony that could
 be produced & examining the body of said Child
 do find that his death proceeded from a natural
 cause of an inflammation and gangreen arising
 from some accidental Contusion on his leg and
 appendings into his body and that the said
 Rachel Cooper was in no wise instrumental to the
 death of the said Child Given under our
 hands and seals the day and year first
 above written

Know all men by these presents that I John Morgan of the County of Orange and State of North Carolina for and in consideration of that love and good will which I have do here toward Jacob Flowers of the County aforesaid have give and grant & by these presents have given granted and made over unto Jacob Flowers his heirs & assigns forever named John Dinah Rachel and Isaac two horses called Dial and fancy four cows & calves four cows & lambs to have and to hold the said Negroes & above named stock from hence forth as his & their proper use without any manner of condition dues or Demands unto the Flowers his heirs and assigns forever and that I the Morgan for myself my heirs and assigns do quitclaim any Demand unto the property above named as witness my hand & Seal this tenth day of March one thousand seven hundred & Eighty Eight signed sealed and delivered in presence of

I Call whom these may come John Morgan do and greeting known all that I John Morgan of the County of Orange State of North Carolina for and consideration of the love and good will which I have toward Jacob Flowers of said County have given granted and by these presents do give grant unto the said Jacob Flowers his heirs and assigns forever three certain tracts or parcels of Land situate lying and being in our County of Orange & Chatham on Cub Creek waters of such hope the first tract Beginning at 2 White Oak Saplings running N 30 Chains to a Pine then N 50 Chains to a White Oak then West to corner Pine & a long line crossing said Creek 45 Chains to a white Oak then South 30 Chains to a Pine then E 75 Chains to a white Oak then North crossing the Creek 30 Chains to the beginning containing four hundred and fifty Acres the second tract is situate lying and being in Orange County on the waters of Morgan Creek adjoining his own Lands beginning at a pine run west 60 Chains to an Oak then North 107 Chains to State then East 60 Chains to pine then South 107 Chains to the first station containing Six hundred and forty Acres the third tract is situate lying and being in Chatham on the Waters of Cub Creek & Bush Creek beginning at his own corner white Oak running South 220 Poles to a red Oak then West 220 Poles to a pine
