I, the Senatus of the County of Orange and State of
South Carolina, placing being weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God
taking into mind the mortality of my Body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do hereby make and Ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God
his grace etc. and my Body I recommend to the earth to
be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion
of my Executors nothing doubting but the general resurrection
shall revive the same again by the mighty power of God
as touching all such worldly Estate wherewith it hath
pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and assign
of the same in following manner and form.

And my Will is that all my Just debts be paid
due here to my well beloved wife Mary Linsley the
true part of all the Land whereon there live the
winding House the stock of all kind all the Negroes
all the Household and plantation utensils and
that my well beloved Daughter Pella Linsley have
the knowledge of the said House and the farm with

Sept 27th
I give his power but providing in the event said Anne
as long as she remains single and that Mary my
Beloved Wife may only hold the above mentioned
articles during her lifetime or widowhood.
Also my will is that all my children that are not
dead as they Mary have as much as those already mar-
ried as near as possible.

Also my intention that each of my Daughters have
 portions out of my Estate after the death of my wife.
 Also that all my lands be equally divided between my
 three Sons viz. Nathaniel Lindsey, John Lindsey and George
 Lindsey and that equal part be that about the Parling
 where Snow-hill and that my Indian Trade be equally divided
 between my three above named Sons. ---

Also if there remain any thing more than is already divided
together after the death of my wife that it be equally
amongst all my children without respect and partly and
finally I appoint my will to be as on Othmanthous in
my faithfull Son in law Harry Edwards to be the sole
Executor of this my last will and Testament and I do
utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other
former testament Wills legacies bequests and Executors
by me in any way before now made and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last
will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this twentieth Day of October in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and twenty
signed sealed published pronounced and declared by
Care John Lindsay as his last Will and Testament in the
presence of us four in the presence of them and in the
presence of each other have

between after the death of my wife that it be equally divided
amongst all my children without respect and lastly and
finally I bequeath my will to my son Nathaniel Lindsey
my faithful Son in law Henry Edwards to be the
Executor of this my last will and Testament and he
utterly disavows and disavows all and every other
former testament which bequeaths and bequeaths
by me in any wise before named written and bequeathed
satisfying and confirming this and no other last my last

title interest and demand whatsoever, as the said George
Bradford had or ought to have (if these presents had been
made) of, in and to all that part of parcel of Lands
and bequeathed to him the said George Bradford
by his father David Bradford deceased in his last will
and Testament, situate lying and being in the County
of Orange and State aforesaid wherein the said George Bradford
deceased lived, containing one hundred acres more or less
as follows, Viz. Beginning at a post oak by the
a small branch on the old line running with said line
about 80 yds. the chain and be sides to a degree
out on a chain and 50 links to a white oak in Concord
Pattern line. thence south 10 degrees East 10 chains and 60
links to a Dog wood on the back thence up the
margins of of said creek to and up at the mouth
said Branch: thence up the meadow through the first
station.
