 shall receive the same again by the mighty power
 of God and as to such worldly Estate which it has
 pleased God to bless me with in this life I give
 and dispose of the same in the following manner & form
 I give and bequeath to my Dear and Loving wife
 Mary after my Debts are paid all my Estate both real
 and personal During her widowhood and in case
 she marries then and in that case I desire she may
 possess and enjoy but one third only and the other two
 thirds to be equally divided between the Children
 Isaac Hendricks Abraham Hendricks William Hendricks

 I hereby appoint my wife Mary Hendricks to be my
 whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and
 Testament and I do hereby utterly Vain all & every
 other will Bequests or Legacies whatsoever by me
 or Granted. & confirm this to be my last will
 and Testament In witness whereof I have
 here unto set my hand & Seal

 of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God
 calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing
 that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and
 Ordain this my last will and Testament that writing
 principally and first of all I give and recommend
 my Soul unto the hand of Almighty God that gave
 it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
 in a Christian decent burial at the discretion of my
 Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrec-
 tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty
 power of God and as to such worldly Estate
 wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with
 in this life I give demise and dispose of the same
 in the manner and form following

first I give and bequeath to my wife Agnes her bed
 & furniture and my bay Mare to be at her disposal
 and to have Creditable maintenance of the benefits
 that may arise from the Land I now possess
 I give and bequeath to my son George Long ten
 pounds which he justly stands entitled to me
 at this time. Item I give and bequeath my
 Daughter Elisabeth a going bay horse four
 years old and as to my Land that I now possess
 I wish it to be equally divided between my Daughter
 Elisabeth and my grand son William Long
 to my moveable estate I allow it to be equally
 divided between my wife Agnes & my Daughter
 Elisabeth and I do hereby appoint and Ordain
 John Hart son of James Hart to be my lawful
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 and I do hereby disallow revoke & disannul
 other Legacies Wills & Testaments made by me
 therefore ratifying and confirming this to be
 my last will and Testament In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
 day of August 1787

Orange County Inquisition indented and taken at the
 plantation of William King in the County aforesaid
 the 9th of June 1788 before me John Taylor Esquire coron-
 er of said County upon view of the Body of Daniel McGarity
 a Child of John McGarity late of the County aforesaid
 and there lying Dead and upon the Oath of John Hagan
 Nathaniel King Docten King Samuel Craig Charles King
 Robert Baker James Blackwood John King Stephen Long
 John Strain Joseph Kirkland & William King good and
 lawful men of the Parish of Saint Matthews the said
 County of Orange who being charged & sworn to enquire
 and in what manner the said Daniel McGarity by
 his death came upon them Doth do say whose names
 and seals are hereunto subscribed and annexed being
 duly summoned sworn on an inquest held the 9th
 day of June 1788 at the house and plantation of
 William King on the Body of Daniel McGarity
 a Child of John McGarity supposed to have
 died of the abuse he received of Rachel Cooper
 after examining all the Testimony that could
 be produced & examining the body of said Child
 do find that his death proceeded from a natural
 cause of an inflammation and gangreen arising
 from some accidental Contusion on his leg and
 appendings into his body and that the said
 Rachel Cooper was in no wise instrumental to the
 death of the said Child Given under our
 hands and seals the day and year first
 above written
