This Indenture made this 31 day of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety three by & Between Hermon Husk of the County of Orange and State of North Carolina of the one part & John Slop esquire of the County & State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Hermon Husk doth put place and bind himself a servant to the said John Slop esquire for and during the term and to the full end of one year from the date hereof during all which time the said Hermon Husk the said John Slop shall faithfully serve, his lawful commands being when gladly obey, he shall not at any time absent himself from his said masters service, without his said masters leave, but shall and will always behave himself in an orderly manner towards his said master, during the term aforesaid & for the term service the said John Slop esquire doth Covenant promise and agree to and with the said Hermon Husk, to pay for him all legal costs of an Indentment performed in Orange County Court at August Sessions

Sessions 1793 against the said Hermon Husk for a petit Larceny whereof he the said Hermon hath been convicted In Testimony whereof the parties to presents have hereunto set their hands & seals the day and year within written
