In the name of God Amen I Nathaniel Patterson of Orange County and State of North Carolina wherein being in a weak sickly state of Body out of hurtful ground and moreover to publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first let all my just Debts and funeral expenses be paid and discharged & se

First I recommend my soul to Almighty God that it and my body to the Earth to be buried at the door of my Executive hereafter named and appointed and as touching such worldly Estate as god has given me in this world I leave and desirous in the way and manner following that is to say I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Isabell one third of all the yearly rents or profits of the Lands and Tenements or Six pounds yearly by year during her life as also Bed & bedding all and singular what she shall choose for to be also her Saddle horse called Ball or twenty five pounds in good money of this State I also her choice of the Cattle and Cows with the profits arising therefrom also her share of all the household furniture or one third part thereof except what I shall hereafter nominate also the old Negroe woman called Mary to be under the direction of my said wife for life. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Ward one year after my decease twenty Shillings current money of this State. —

I give and bequeath all my Duded lands to my Son William containing one hundred and fifty acres with all and singular the improvements & implemants of horses and Dittos dues and demands ... Eighth what I have before given or hereafter shall give. I give and bequeath to John Ward son of my Daughter Margaret fourth Daughter to Shillings current money of this State.

Also I give and bequeath twenty Shillings to Hezekiah Ray current money of this State.
Also I give and bequeath to my Daughter Isabell Ray twenty shillings current money of this State.
Also I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Baker twenty shillings current money of this State.
Also I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary her bedding of every kind with that bed call'd Paddy with a woman's Saddle and Bridle as also a cow and Calf also a chest the value of twenty Shillings and a handfull of Silting when she marries at her mother's descretion to having furniture what my wife Lu's cause to give her.
All and singular things after my just debts are paid I give and bequeath to my beloved Son before named William all and singular creation of every kind such as Horses Cows sheep and Swine subject what esalready given and willed to my Wife and Daughters.

I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved wife Isabell and my Son William and John Ray my Son in law to be my sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament revoking all and singular Wills by me made during this my last as writing my hand and seal as also by and with the consent of my wife this 25th
