

Know all men by these presents that I Robert Ashley of the County of Orange and State of North Carolina hath Bargained sold and Delivered unto Jeremiah Edge of the County and State aforesaid one good Horse one Cow Half two feather beds & furniture one Dozen Pewter Plates Three Large Dishes two Basins one Case Knives & Forks three flaxen Wheels Three Belling Hoes, one Mans Saddle, Womens Saddle, two Chisels two Bedsteads two Plover Hoes, two axes, one Mattock one Rifle Gun seven Green Eight head of Hogs six hundred Bacon, and all my flax and cotton for which the said Robert Ashley doth warrant and forever Defend unto the said Jeremiah Edge his heirs &c for and in consideration of the Sum of forty pounds Specie Given Under my hand & Seal this 20. day of February 1775

I Anthony Stanford being weak in body & low Condition but of sound mind and memory do come my Soul to Almighty god who gave it and my body to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors and after my Debts & funeral Charges being paid. I do leave and bequeath to Elisabeth my well beloved wife two feather beds and furniture one walnut Chest and all her Cloaths & her Spinning Wheel, all the Pewter in the House and all the Jewellery in the House

and the Bay Mare called Bonny and two Cows with the house I now live in during her widowhood to be disposed of at her pleasure I do leave and bequeath to my son Charles Stanford the sum of ten shillings I do leave and bequeath to my son Robert Stanford the sum of ten shillings, I do leave and bequeath to my Daughter Agnes the sum of ten shillings I do leave and bequeath to my Daughter Fan the sum of ten shillings, I do leave to my Daughter Martha two Cows & one Kieper and one feather Bed and furniture and riding saddle and Spinning wheel, I do leave to my Daughter Elisabeth one Spinning wheel and a weaving Loom and one feather Bed & furniture and riding saddle and Spinning wheel. I do leave to my Daughter Mary one feather Bed ^{furniture} one young Cow riding saddle and Spinning wheel I do leave to my Daughter Margaret one young Cow and Spinning wheel, and the sum of two pounds, I do leave to my grand Child Fanny King one two year old Kieper and one year Schooling, I do leave to my son John James and my son William my land to be divided ^{equally} quantity and quality James to have his part where he now lives. Wm to have the part where I now live, my Sons James & Wm to find & support my wife Elisabeth for herself & Creatures during life provided she dont marry, I do leave to my son James one Mattock, I do leave to my son James & Wm one Cutting Box between them handsaw. I leave to my son William one axe and one Plover

and Tacklin & the Dick Cotts, and I do constitute
and appoint my Wife Elisabeth and my Son
James Executors to this my Last Will and Testament
fully Executed given under my hand & Seal this
11 day of June in the year of our Lord 1789

Know all men by these presents that I George Doherty
of Orange County have bargained and sold to Saml
Hogg Esquire of said County all my Stock of Cattle
consisting twelve in Number fifty Sheep and eighty
Hogs be the same more or less together with all
Grain of every Species and all my household
furniture and farming Utensils the same to be
as a security to him for six hundred pounds
claimed by said James Hogg Esq. Guardian for
Polly Bunke orphan of Thomas Bunke esq.
Deceased for negro here and the rent of Land
provided always and nevertheless that the said
George Doherty shall have the privilege of
Using any part of the grain he may find

anyway for family use and for feeding the stock
and the said stock as aforesaid is to continue on
the possession of said Doherty he to be accountable
to the said Hogg for the value of all that may
be used on the plantation or that may die
by casualties for the Term of three years.

The Condition of the above obligation is such that
in case the said Geo Doherty has contracted a debt
with said James Hogg Esquire for negro hire
and rent of Land, as Guardian for said Polly
Bunke to a certain amount not yet adjusted
and that if on a final settlement the said Geo
Doherty his heirs and Executors shall pay to
said Hogg Esq. Guardian to Polly Bunke
aforesaid all the balance that may appear to be
due at a General settlement on or before the
first day of January 1793 with the accounting
and that the above obligation to be void else
remain in full force and virtue Given under my
hand & Seal the 2 day of January 1790
