In the name of God Amen I Daniel Sullivan of the County of Orange and State of North Carolina being very sick and weak in body but of perfect Mind and memory thanks be given unto God Calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hand of almighty God that gives and my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial and at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting

at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate which it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form First I give and bequeath to Margaret my dearly loved Wife one hundred Acres of Land on the West side of the Tract during her lifetime and after her death to be my son Sullivan I also give to him one young Black Horse one Cow and Calf one Ewe and Lamb one sow and pigs Also I give to my old son Joseph Sullivan one hundred Acres of Land on the South side of the Tract I also give him one young Sord Mare and one Cow and Calf one Ewe and Lamb one sow and pigs. Also I give my son Daniel Sullivan one hundred Acres Land joining the first I also give him one horse one Cow & Calf one Ewe and Lamb one Sow & pigs I also I give my youngest son Edmund Sullivan one hundred Acres of Land joining the

same place. Also I give my eldest Mary one Shilling Sterling also I give my Daughter Sarah one Shilling Sterling I give my Daughter Margaret one Shilling Sterling. Also I give my son ^{Sarah} Judian one Shilling Sterling. Also I give my son Sullivan one Shilling Sterling, and the of my Estate I give to my Wife Margaret to give and bestow as she sees best. And hereby utterly disallow Revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments Legacies Bequest and Executors by me anywise before named Made and Begun Ratifying and Confirming this and not to be my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this ninth day February in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and ninety Two —
