Person County This Indenture made the fourth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three between James Graham Chairman of the County Court of Person County and State aforesaid on behalf of the said County and three purchasers of the one part and Thomas Moore of the other last aforesaid that the said James Graham in compliance with an Order of said County Court made the fourth day of June and according to the direction of the act of assembly in that case made and provided did put to sale and vend the said Thomas Moore an African American Male with the said Thomas Moore to live after the manner of an apprentice and servant, until he said apprentice shall attain to the age of eighteen years during which term the said apprentice her master faithfully shall serve his lawful commands every where to wit that he shall not at any time absent himself from his said master's service without leave, but in all things be a good and faithful servant shall behave towards the said master. And the said Thomas Moore with consent, promise and agree to and with the said James Graham that he will teach and instruct or cause to be taught and instructed the said Martha Ginnaway to read and write also the art of a spinner, and that he will constantly find & provide for said apprentice during the term aforesaid sufficient diet washing soap and appareling her an apprentice and also all the things necessary for her in sickness and in health. It witness whereof the parties to this indenture have interchangeably set their hands and seals this day & year first above written.
