I desire to recommend my soul into the  
hands of that God who gave it, in sure & certain  
hope of its being in a future day restored to the  
body wherein it now exists, it is also my desire  
that my body be interred with decent Christian burial,  
with regard to such property as the Lord has left me  
with. I dispose of it in the following manner

I give & bequeath unto my living wife Elizabeth Hatcher the following property, to her one Negro woman named Sarah, also, one horse & one feather bed and furniture which she is to have her choice of, I give to her & her heirs forever — I give unto my wife Elizabeth all the money that is due to me & all that is now in my possession, I give to her & her heirs forever all the residue of my property that is not yet bequeathed I give to the use of my wife Elizabeth Hatcher during her life or Widewhood, and after her death or Marriage I give it to my few Children (that) Charles, Thomas, John, Elizabeth, & Mary Hatcher to be Equally divided between them, I give it to them & their heirs forever.

Lastly I hereby constitute & appoint my wife Elizabeth Hatcher & Richard Atkinson Lawer to sign my last will & Testament, witnessing this to be my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of Aug. in the year of Lord one thousand eight hundred
