Item, I give & bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Wether the following property, (to wit) one Negro woman named Hannah, also one house & one feather bed and furniture which she is to have her choice of. I give to her & her heirs forever — I give unto my wife Elizabeth all the money that is due to me & all that is now in my possession. I give to her & her heirs forever — all the residue of my property that is not yet bequeathed I give to the use of my wife Elizabeth Wether during her life or widowhood, and after her death or marriage I give it to my four children (to wit) Charles, Thomas, John, Elizabeth, & Mary Wether to be Equally divided between them, I give it to them & their heirs forever.

Lastly, I hereby constitute & appoint my wife Elizabeth Wether & Richard Atkinson Executors to this my last will & Testament, declaring this to be my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 13th day of May, in the year of Lord one thousand eight hundred
