 that I Elizabeth border of the County of Baswell and State  
 of New Hampshire for and in consideration of the sum of fifty  
 pounds four shillings lawful money of this State to me  
 in hand paid by Jacob border of the County and State  
 aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have  
 bargained sold & delivered & by these presents according to  
 due form of law do bargain sell & do deliver unto the  
 said Jacob border and his heirs forever hereof I have had  
 of cattle marked very with brass nail & hole in the left  
 ear and hole in the right also a written parchment  
 with brass & two nails in the right ear and brass and  
 iron which in the left to gather with of two ears and  
 furniture two dozen of gutter plates three barrels and  
 two gutter shaves down head of hogs with all the brass  
 that is now on the ground to have and to hold unto the  
 bargain and premises unto the said Jacob border his heirs  
 forever and against all persons shall remain and be  
 forever defended by these presents from going either in  
 or person whatsoever whomsoever I have hereunto set  
 my hand and affix my seal this 26 day of August  
 1792

This sheweth that the 27th day of March in the year 1792  
 appeared John Paine esq. in behalf of the freeholders of the  
 County of Paine and the township and village of the  
 said Paine and Richard border of the County of Paine  
 who testified that the said John Paine Esq. in pursuance to an order  
 of the Court made the day and date above written  
 did first show and laid out to the said Richard border  
 Jacob Pottersford an orphan son of the age of three years  
 lay out next to him after the manner of an apprentice  
 and desired that she should attain to the age of fifteen  
 years during all which time he said Master should pay  
 she should his lawfull commands every where going  
 they she should not at any time absent herself from  
 her said Master except in all things as a good and  
 faithful servant shall behave towards her said Master  
 And the said Richard border with consent, pleasure and  
 agreed to and with the said John Paine esquire that he  
 will teach and instruct and cause to be taught and  
 taught the said Jacob Pottersford Reading to law to read  
 & write the said Art and Mystery of a Hunter and  
 that he will constantly feed and provide for the apprentice  
 a good sufficient diet washing clothing and apparel  
 fitting for an apprentice and servant and also all other  
 things necessary both in clothing and in diet the said  
 having the Parties to these presents hath voluntarily and  
 without compulsion then and the day and year first above  
 written
